Introduction

Many educational attainments precede earning a baccalaureate, and one informative way to describe them is to enumerate what is commonly referred to as the “educational pipeline.” The numbers associated with this concept imply student flow. The pipeline usually starts with the number of people in a pre-school-age cohort. The numbers assigned to the middle junctures of the pipeline suggest the proportions of the group who eventually attend K-12 graded schools, complete high school, and enroll in college. The final point of the pipeline normally indicates the proportion who will earn postsecondary degrees. Snapshots of the entire pipeline indicate how many students make the transition from one juncture to another; and historical pipeline data suggest what changes can be expected in the number of degrees conferred when there are changes in population size, high school completion rates, or college graduation rates.

This section offers data from various sources to reflect the major points of the educational pipeline for CSU bachelor degree holders. It begins with a brief description of the California population and an overview of the number of students enrolled at California K-12 graded schools and community colleges. The remaining pages describe access to the university (i.e., new entrants) and persistence to graduation.

Primary Sources of New Students

The two primary sources for new students to the CSU are graduates from California public high schools who enter the CSU as first-time freshmen and undergraduate transfers from California community colleges; and the origin and size of these two groups receive the most statistical attention. In the case of high school graduates, access to the CSU is summarized by college-going rates, where the numerator is the number of new first-time freshmen and the denominator is the number of high school graduates from the previous year.

Persistence and Continuation Rates

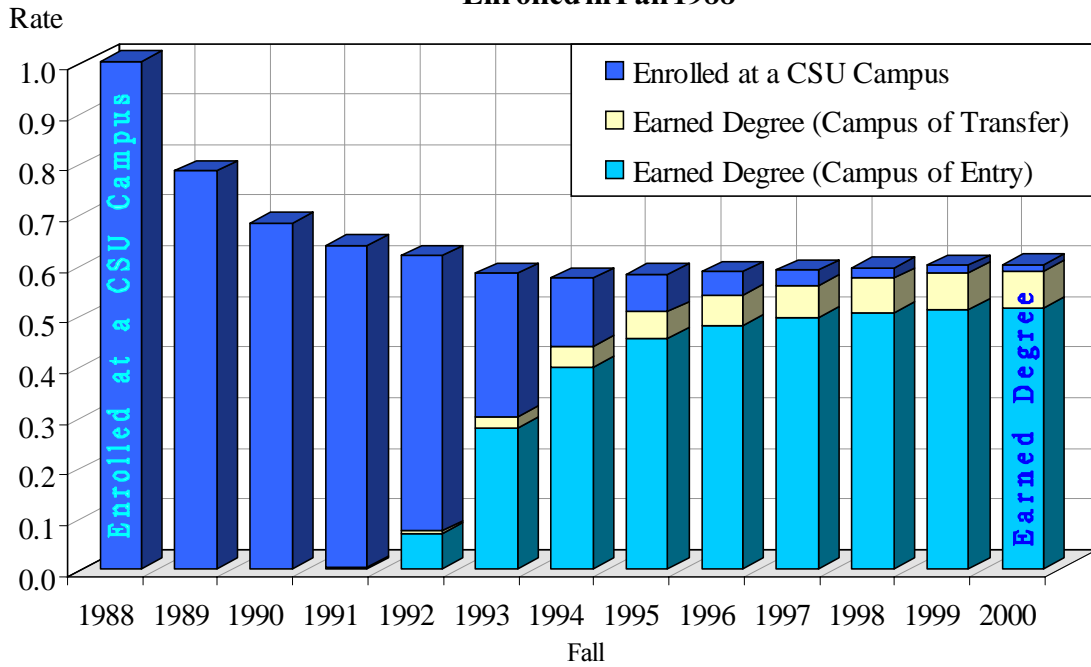
To illustrate how new students persist to degree, annual continuation and graduation rates are charted across 12-year intervals for both first-time freshmen and undergraduate transfers in figures following this introduction.

The most recent 12-year graduation histories are based on the experiences of two cohorts of entering students who were admitted to the CSU as regular admissions: fall 1988 first-time freshmen from California high schools and fall 1988 undergraduate transfers from California community colleges. For each successive fall term, continuation and graduation rates are represented by stacked bars. The top two tiers display the proportion of students who graduated in all previous terms, the bottom tier shows the proportion of students who were enrolled in the fall term under observation. Student enrollments were not tracked across all terms in the college year. Thus the continuation rates do not reflect continuous uninterrupted enrollment; they reflect the proportion identified as undergraduate enrollments at the beginning of each college year.

The “persistence rates” measure the proportion of students who did not withdraw from the university before attaining bachelor’s degrees. Thus, “persistence” can be viewed as the opposite of “attrition.” After 12 years, 58.8 percent of the first-time freshmen had graduated and 1.2 percent were still pursuing their degree objectives for a persistence rate of 60 percent. The graduation and continuation percentages for transfers were 70.2 percent and 0.7 percent, for a persistence rate of 70.9 percent.

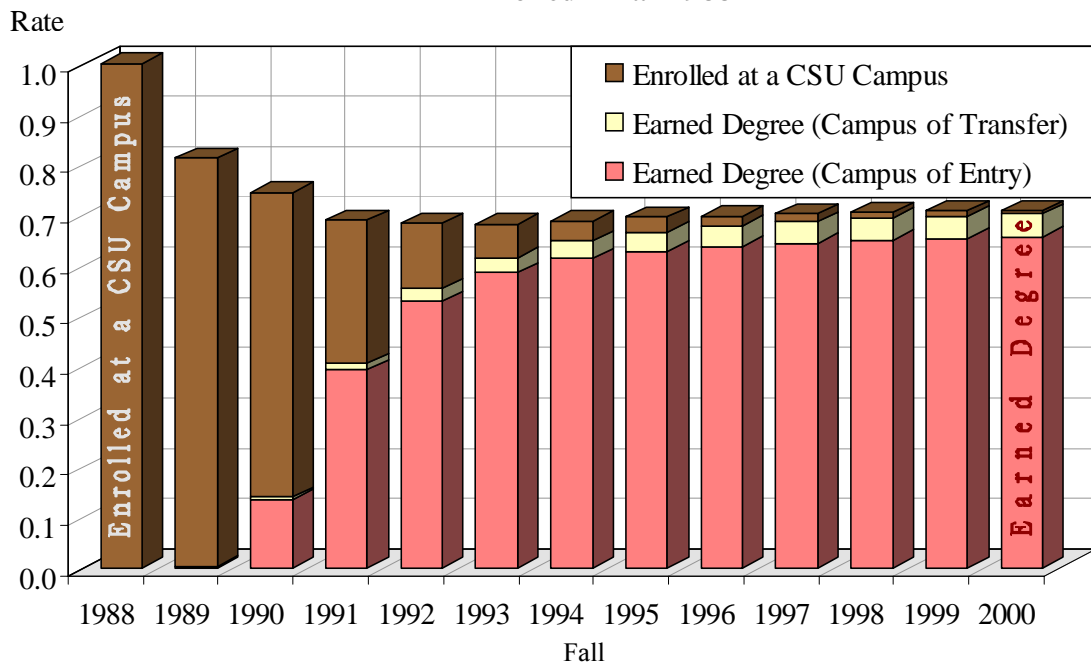
The data also convey many facets about when students graduate. For example, the modal year of graduation for freshmen is their fifth year, with the average being about 5.5 years. For transfers, the third year yields the largest annual number of graduates, and their average time-to-degree is nearly 3.5 years. Partial data from subsequent cohorts suggest that 12-year graduation rates are improving. Much of this optimism comes from the observed improvement in one-year continuation rates (i.e., enrolling for a second fall term). These rates are listed for successive cohorts of entering students by enrollment status and admission basis. Continuation rates are also shown for students who were at the campus of origin as well as for students who continued at any CSU campus. For both freshmen and undergraduate transfers, the first year of enrollment is a critical period of adjustment and transition. More than half of all attrition takes place between the first and second year of enrollment. Improvement in one-year continuation rates, therefore, translates into an increased proportion of eventual graduates.
