

## ***Introduction***

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The California State University has awarded more higher education degrees than any other college or university in California over the past few years. Since 1975-1976, about half of all baccalaureate degrees conferred in the state have been granted by the CSU. Since the establishment of the system in 1960-1961, the CSU has conferred more than 2 million degrees: 1,701,751 baccalaureates, 360,830 master's, and 587 joint doctorates.

### **Degrees Conferred**

Degree conferrals grew steadily from the inception of the system (fall 1960) until the 1984-1985 college year, increasing by over 300 percent. During the latter 1980s, awards were relatively stable; 53,000 to 58,000 students a year received diplomas. By 1992-1993 the annual number of degrees awarded peaked at 68,137. After five years, the 1992-1993 figure was surpassed and the 71,346 degrees granted in 2000-2001 set a new high. Baccalaureate awards for this year numbered 56,983 or 80 percent of all degrees granted. Graduate degrees were conferred on 14,363 CSU students.

### **Minority Representation**

The number of underrepresented minorities obtaining CSU undergraduate degrees has shown impressive growth during the past two decades. Baccalaureate awards for nonwhite students more than tripled between 1975-1976 and 2000-2001, growing from 6,510 to 23,658. The number of white non-Latinos receiving degrees dropped over 16 percent during the same time period: 28,958 degrees were awarded in 1975-1976 compared to 24,217 conferrals in 2000-2001. Bachelor's degree awards for white, non-Latino students reached its apex in 1991-1992 when 33,979 degrees were conferred. Between 1975-1976 and 2000-2001, nonwhite students also demonstrated marked growth in the number of graduate degrees earned. Degree awards for nonwhite students tripled during that period while overall growth for graduate degree conferrals was just 42 percent.

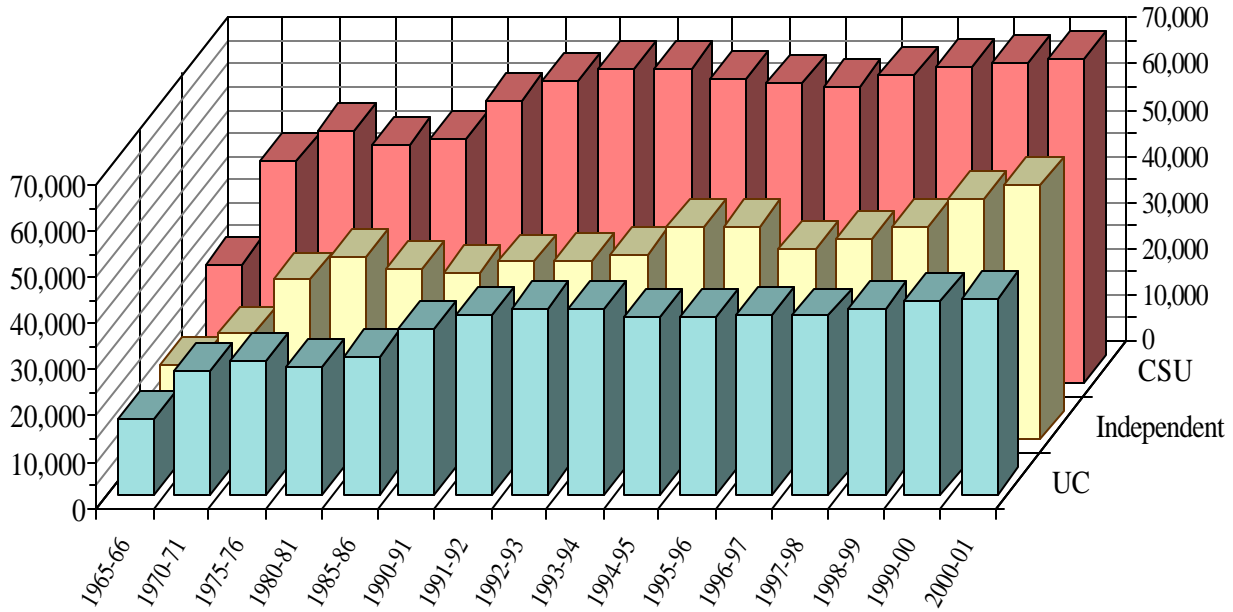
### **Degree Disciplines**

Historically, the bachelor's degree awarded most often in the CSU has been business and management. This pattern prevailed in 2000-2001 as well. More than one-fifth of all undergraduates earned a baccalaureate in this major (12,606 students). Social sciences degrees (5,964) and conferrals in the interdisciplinary studies (7,127) each comprised about 10 percent of all baccalaureates earned during this period. Representing more than 6 percent, psychology degrees (3,787) were awarded next most often. Degrees awarded in the combined academic disciplines of social sciences and psychology (i.e., academic disciplines concerned with the behavioral sciences) constitute 17 percent of all undergraduate degrees earned in 2000-2001.

Graduate students earned a degree in education most often during 2000-2001. Over 30 percent of all graduate degree awards (4,512) were in this academic area. Education traditionally has been the most popular postbaccalaureate degree earned because of the CSU's mission in preparing K-12 educators. Graduate degree conferrals for business and management (2,470), also popular, represented 17 percent of the total. Graduate awards for the public affairs and services discipline numbered 1,347 or about 10 percent of all graduate degrees awarded, while the health professions graduated 1,203 students or about 8 percent of the total.

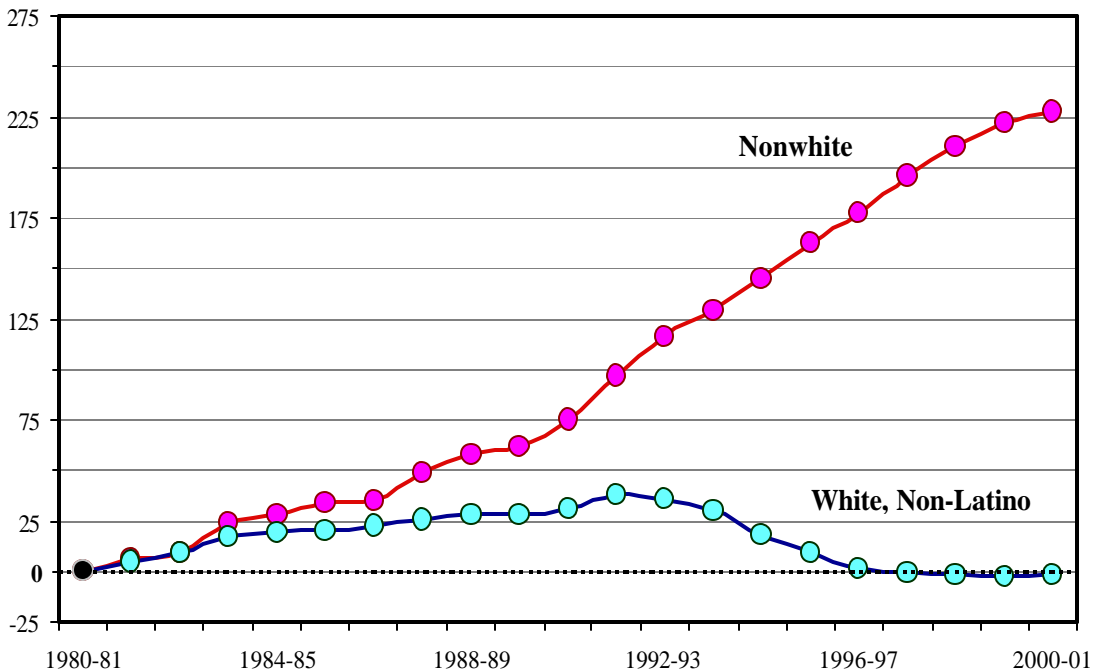

**1965-1966 to 2000-2001**



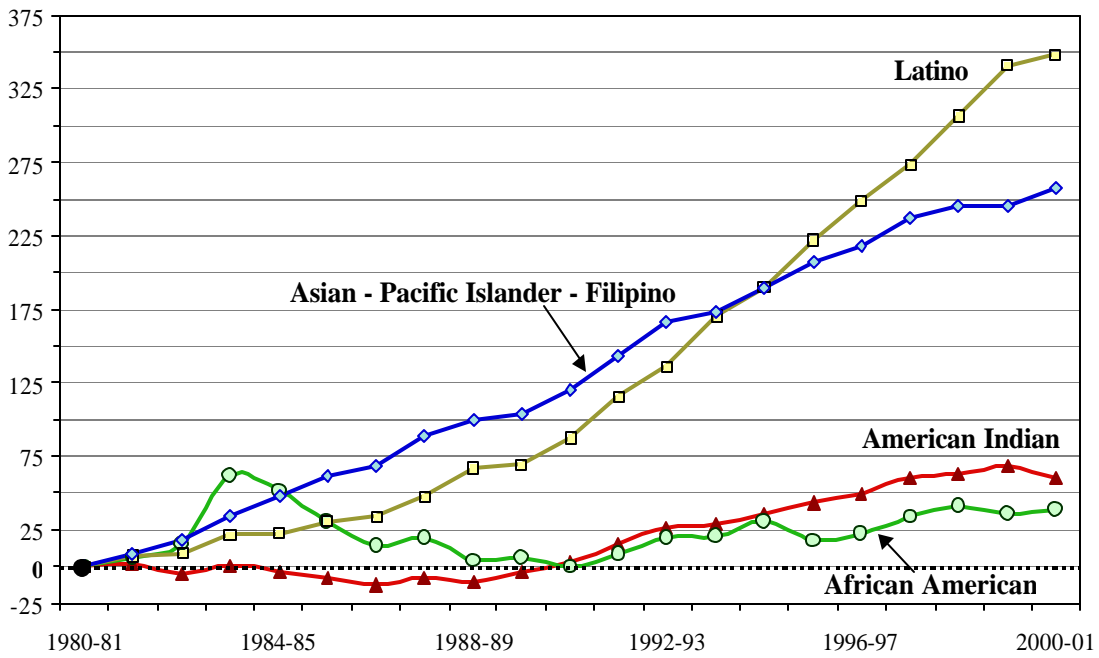
**Figure 22**
