**Subject: Education Financing Foundation Assistance for Students Affected by Hurricane Katrina**

The Education Financing Foundation of California has generously contributed \$100,000 to the California State University (CSU) to assist students affected by the Hurricane Katrina disaster in the Gulf region. These funds have been provided to benefit directly the affected students and to address their financial need as determined by campus financial aid offices. As reflected on Attachment A, the Foundation funding has been allocated to campuses that accommodated students for the fall term based on the number of displaced Gulf region students that campuses reported as enrolled for fall 2005.

Students from the Gulf region who are enrolled at a CSU campus for 2005-06 and who were adversely impacted by the Katrina disaster are eligible to receive these funds if the campus financial aid office determines that the student demonstrates financial need. No portion of this funding may be used for administrative or other expenses of the campuses.

If you have any questions about these funds or if it is determined that none of the affected students who enrolled at your campus require assistance from this funding, please contact Ms. Mary L.
