SUBJECT: Basic Teacher Credentials in Self-Support Pilot Program (Single Subject, Multiple Subject, Special Education)

Executive Order 1099, revised October 5, 2018, authorizes the chancellor to grant an exception to offer a basic teacher credential program in self-support, based on local demand for teachers and the cost to the student. Given the current and projected statewide need for credentialed teachers, the chancellor has approved a pilot program for campuses to develop basic teacher credential programs in self-support. The pilot is approved for a period of five years to include the academic years from 2019-20 to 2024-25. The Chancellor's Office will conduct a review at the end of the five-year period to determine if the program should continue.

In order to participate, campuses shall:

- Comply with all system policy requirements including, but not limited to, EO 1099, and seek all appropriate approvals as they would for any other credential program.
- Notify the Chancellor's Office of the intent to plan a basic teacher credential program in self-support.
- Prepare a cost-recovery budget showing per unit cost to students and the total cost to complete the program.

Presidents should determine whether their campus will participate in this pilot program. Notifications of intent should be sent to credentialpilot@calstate.edu by January 2019 for fall 2019 and one year in advance for each subsequent year.
