ASSEMBLY BILL**No. 2401****Introduced by Assembly Member Block**

February 19, 2010

An act to amend Section 66202 of the Education Code, relating to public postsecondary education.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2401, as amended, Block. Public postsecondary education: admissions policy.

Existing law, known as the Donahoe Higher Education Act, provides for a public postsecondary education system in this state. This system consists of the University of California, the California State University, and the California Community Colleges. Among other things, the Donahoe Higher Education Act sets forth legislative intent with respect to enrollment planning and admission priority practice at the undergraduate resident student level for the California State University and the University of California.

This bill would ~~express the intent of the Legislature, subject to existing admission priority practices, that state this legislative intent with respect to enrollment planning and admission, rather than admission priority practice. The bill would require~~ the California State University, *within existing enrollment categories*, to provide applicants residing in the local service area, as defined, ~~priority~~ admission to the applicant's local California State University campus over other California residents or out-of-state applicants entering as first-time freshmen or sophomores, provided they meet relevant admissions criteria.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 66202 of the Education Code is amended
2 to read:
3 66202. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature that the following
4 categories be followed, insofar as practicable in the following
5 numerical order, for the purpose of enrollment planning and
6 admission ~~priority practice~~ at the undergraduate resident student
7 level for the California State University and the University of
8 California:
9 (1) Continuing undergraduate students in good standing.
10 (2) California community college transfer students who have
11 successfully concluded a course of study in an approved transfer
12 agreement program.
13 (3) (A) Other California community college students who have
14 met all of the requirements for transfer.
15 (B) As stated in legislative findings, the transfer function plays
16 a key role in meeting the state’s goals of educational equity.
17 Therefore, the Board of Regents of the University of California
18 and the Board of Trustees of the California State University shall
19 declare as policy for this subparagraph and paragraph (2) that
20 students who are eligible to transfer and who are from historically
21 underrepresented groups or economically disadvantaged families
22 shall be given preference, to the fullest extent possible under state
23 and federal law, statutes, and regulations, in transfer admissions
24 decisions, and shall design policies in conformity with state and
25 federal statutes and regulations intended to facilitate their success
26 in achieving transfer.
27 (4) Other qualified transfer students.
28 (5) California residents entering at the freshman or sophomore
29 levels.
30 (b) It is further the intent of the Legislature that within each of
31 the preceding enrollment categories, the following groups of
32 applicants ~~receive priority consideration in admissions practice~~ *be*
33 *granted admission* in the following order:
34 (1) Residents of California who are recently released veterans
35 of the ~~armed forces~~ *Armed Forces* of the United States.

1 (2) Transfers from California public community colleges.

2 (3) Applicants who have been previously enrolled at the campus
3 to which they are applying, provided they left this institution in
4 good standing.

5 (4) Applicants who have a degree or credential objective that
6 is not generally offered at other public institutions of higher
7 learning within California.

8 (5) Applicants for whom the distance involved in attending
9 another institution would create financial or other hardships.

10 (c) It is further the intent of the Legislature that those veterans
11 referred to in paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) who were enrolled
12 in good standing at a campus of the University of California or at
13 one of the California State Universities prior to military service
14 receive priority over other veterans recently released from military
15 service.

16 (d) (1) ~~It is further the intent of the Legislature that, within~~
17 ~~Within~~ each of the ~~priority~~ enrollment categories in subdivisions
18 (a) to (c), inclusive, the California State University *shall* provide
19 applicants who reside in the local service area of a campus with
20 ~~priority~~ admission to the applicant’s local California State
21 University campus over other California residents or out-of-state
22 applicants entering as first-time freshmen or sophomores, provided
23 they meet relevant admissions criteria. An applicant who is
24 provided ~~priority~~ admission pursuant to this subdivision shall be
25 subject to any additional admissions criteria resulting from
26 ~~impaction of a major or campus.~~

27 (2) As used in this subdivision, “local service area” means the
28 CSU service area for the campus as set forth in the California State
29 University Coded Memorandum AA-2005-05, dated February 23,
30 2005.
