The Academic Senate of the California State University (CSU) is an elected body of over 50 members who represent the 23 campuses of the California State University system. The Academic Senate CSU serves as an advisory group, which makes recommendations to the CSU Chancellor, the CSU Board of Trustees, and the California Legislature on matters relating to education issues and academic governance.

The Academic Senate CSU was formed in 1963. Existence of a statewide senate is due in great part to passage of the Donahoe Act of 1960, which enacted into law the Master Plan for Higher Education in California.
