

Executive Order No.: 724

Title: Campus user Off-Campus Study Program Fee,
California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo

Effective Date: January 26, 2000

Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective January 26, 2000, California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo is authorized to establish a campus user Off-Campus Study Program Fee. Fee amounts will range between \$8 and \$10,000 and will cover non-instructional expenses for optional quarter-long, off-campus study programs. The fees authorized herein are to reimburse the university for non-instructional expenses such as travel, facilities, goods, and other services necessary to provide a General Fund supported course at an off-campus location. The General Fund supported course must also be available on the university's campus with equivalent course credit without the requirement to pay the off-campus expenses. Fee revenue from these user fees may be assessed only to reimburse the cost to the campus of furnishing the services, goods, and facilities and may not be used to supplant state support for instruction.

The new campus user fees must be deposited in the General Fund and is credited to the support appropriation current in the year of receipt (Education Code Section 89724(a)).
