Subject: Addition of Four Degree-Majors to Disciplines of Interest for
Establishing Systemwide Lower-Division Transfer Patterns

In partnership with the Academic Senate CSU, we continue to make plans for bringing together campus representatives of majors (disciplines) of interest, as outlined in Coded Memorandum AA-2004-31 from Executive Vice Chancellor David Spence and Academic Senate CSU Chair David McNeil to the Academic Council and Chairs, CSU campus Academic Senates. These are the groups that will define, for their own majors, systemwide lower-division transfer patterns.

In an August 19, 2004 meeting facilitated by the ASCSU, several campus Senate chairs encouraged us to insure that majors with smaller systemwide enrollments not be overlooked when developing agreements on transfer patterns. We let the chairs know that we anticipate inviting smaller majors to develop transfer pattern agreements after completing this year's effort focused on larger-enrollment majors. However, a means for taking campus Senate chairs' advice seriously is to seek transfer pattern agreements for at least a few smaller majors in the current year. In doing so, we may at the same time visibly insure that majors that may be of special interest to students from traditionally under-represented groups are included as transfer patterns are developed.

Accordingly, this is a request that campuses offering such degree major programs add to the list of majors attached to AA-2004-31 the four that are attached to this memorandum: (1) African-American Studies, Black Studies; (2) Asian-American Studies; (3) Chicana/Chicano and Latina/Latino Studies; and (4) Native American Studies.

- When responding by the October 15, 2004 deadline with names of campus representatives for each major of interest, please also include names of campus representatives for this group of four additional majors.
- Please also recall that you will facilitate our work, especially of choosing disciplinary major facilitators (group leaders), if you send us your names as early as possible, prior to October 15th.
