Subject: REMINDER: Statutory Requirement for an Educational Program Pertaining to

the United States Constitution Day

Pursuant to legislation passed by Congress in 2005, each educational institution that receives Federal funds from the United States (U.S.) Department of Education shall hold a Constitution Day educational program on September 17 of each year, commemorating the September 17, 1787 signing of the U.S. Constitution.
