**SUBJECT:** 2001/02 Retirement Adjustment

The CSU is in receipt of State General Funds for 2001/02 employer-paid retirement increases. The Department of Finance is required to adjust the Budget Act appropriation to reflect California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) employer retirement contribution rate changes. The 2000/01 and 2001/02 employer contribution rates are provided below:

<u>CSU Employee Group</u>	<u>2000/01 Rates</u>	<u>2001/02 Rates</u>
Unit 8 (includes 8 percent employee contribution rate paid by CSU)	10.729 %	17.368 %
MPP Directors and Lieutenants of Public Safety and other Unit 9 Firefighter Classifications	2.729 %	9.638 %
All other CSU Employees	0 %	4.166 %

The attachment provides the 2001/02 CSU employer-paid retirement increase by campus. Campus increases are based on campus 2001/02 final budget salaries and applied 2001/02 retirement rate changes. Permanent base budget increases will be included in the 2002/03 CSU budget.
