

**SUBJECT:** Report on the Use of Lottery Funds for Libraries & Academic Technology

The October 4<sup>th</sup> memorandum from Chancellor Reed describes the one-time allocation to campuses from Lottery Funds of \$9 million. Of these dollars, 1/3 are for library acquisitions and 2/3 for academic technology improvements. Several campuses have inquired if there are any guidelines for the report on how these funds were used requested by the Chancellor to be submitted to me by July 31, 2002. I have included the guidelines below.

The report should take the form of a letter that details the following:

◆ LIBRARY

- Funds expended on additional library acquisitions.
- Funds expended on additional or improved library services. Please detail amounts spent on equipment, release time, or vendor/consultant support.

◆ ACADEMIC TECHNOLOGY

- New Services Acquired — specify if through release time, hardware or software acquisitions, vendor/consultant support, or combination thereof.
- Existing Services Enhanced or Supported - specify if through release time, hardware or software acquisitions, vendor/consultant support, or combination thereof.
