Attached please find five copies of Executive Order 187, establishing residence determination dates for tuition purposes for 1974. In accordance with the Education Code, these dates immediately precede the earliest opening of fall semesters and quarters respectively. Dates for other terms will be issued as soon as campus academic calendars have been set for 1974-75.

Please be reminded that the uniform residence determination law requires that residence determination dates be published in campus catalogs. In all likelihood, dates for all terms should be available prior to deadlines for submitting catalog copy. If they are not, provision should be made for their insertion when galleys are reviewed.

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to Education Code Section 22818 and to implement Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 22800) of Division 16.5 of the Education Code, and pursuant to Section 41903 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code.
