

Executive Order No.: 391
Title: Delegation of Authority – Establish, Increase,
Decrease, or Abolish Recreational Facilities Fees
Not Exceeding Ten Dollars (\$10.00)
Effective Date: June 1, 1982
Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to Chapter III, Section 6, subdivision "m" of the Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees of The California State University.

Effective June 1, 1982, authority is hereby delegated to the President of Sonoma State University to establish, increase, decrease, or abolish recreational facilities fees in amounts not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00) per single use for use of recreational facilities during noninstructional periods by families of Sonoma State University faculty, staff and students. The fee schedule of up to ten dollars (\$10.00) per family may be charged for each of the following three sessions:


1. from the day after classes end for the Spring semester through June 30;
2. the month of July;
3. from August 1 through the day before classes begin for the Fall semester.

The President is delegated the authority to amend this schedule at his discretion so long as the fees imposed do not exceed ten dollars per single use and a copy of such amendment is sent to the Vice Chancellor of Business Affairs.

The President, before charging such fees, must publicize the established schedule of hours and fees to the degree necessary to inform the interested public.

Income from the fees collected pursuant to this Executive Order may be expended only for the cost of operation and maintenance of the facilities for which a charge is made. Maintenance cost may include provision for improvement of the recreational facilities and liability insurance as necessary.

The University fiscal officer shall have the ultimate responsibility for collecting, expending, and reporting all recreational facilities fees. These fees will be deposited and expended through the State College Trust Fund. Income and expenditure will be reported in year-end closing financial statements for Trust Fund operations.
