Executive Order No. 603
Title: Fee for Housing Facilities
Effective Date: July 1, 1993
Supersedes: Executive Order No. 593

This executive order is issued pursuant to Education Code Sections 89700, 90012, and 90068 as delegated in Section 42004 of Title 5, California Code of Regulations and Section 6-e of Chapter III of the Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees.

Effective July 1, 1993, fees for housing governed by Article 5 (commencing with Section 42000) of Subchapter 5, Chapter 1, Division 5, Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations shall be charged as follows:

A. General Fees

1. Housing license fees, security deposits, and head resident fees are included in Attachment 1. The housing license fees cover an academic year. The actual calendar days covered vary from campus to campus. Information on the starting date, ending date, and days on which the facility is closed may be obtained from the individual campus.
2. Board fees and frequency of meals are not established by this executive order. However, the information is included in Attachment 1 for information purposes. Information on the calendar days covered by the board fees may be obtained from the individual campus.

B. Miscellaneous Fees

1. Daily, Weekly and Annual Rates (including guest fees)
 - a. Daily Rate (when offered by a campus)

Room Only	\$ 3 to \$ 65
Room and Board	12 to 70
 - b. Weekly Rate (when offered by a campus)

Room Only	\$ 21 to \$ 350
Room and Board	60 to 445

2. Service Fee

Service fee means a nonrefundable fee required of a license to cover the added costs incurred in collecting and processing a license fee by installments (Title 5, Section 42000(i)). The service fee charged by a campus may vary as follows:

\$4 to \$10 per installment payment.

3. Late Fee


Late fee means a payment required of a licensee who fails to pay any fee when due (Title 5, Section 42000(j)). The late fee charged by a campus may vary as follows:

\$10 to \$50 per late payment.

4. Check Returned Fee

\$10 shall be charged for all checks returned, regardless of the cause.
