

Subject: Campus User Fee for Distance Learning Courses—California State University, Sacramento—Executive Order No. 670

I am transmitting to you a copy of Executive Order No. 670 which authorizes at California State University, Sacramento the establishment of a campus user fee for distance learning courses. Based upon a review of the consultation process employed by the campus and upon the recommendation of the campus Student Fee Advisory Committee, appropriate and meaningful consultation has occurred as required by Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06.

In accordance with policy of The California State University, the campus president has the responsibility for implementing Executive Orders where applicable and for maintaining the campus repository and index for all Executive Orders.

Executive Order No.: 670

Title: Campus User Fee for Distance Learning Courses—California State University, Sacramento

Effective Date: July 17, 1997

Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective with the spring semester 1998, California State University, Sacramento is authorized to establish a campus user fee for distance learning courses in the amount of \$75 per credit hour. Pursuant to Section 89724(a) of the Education Code, money received from this fee is appropriated for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature. Revenues received from this fee must be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the General Fund (Government Code Section 16300 *et seq.*).
