



Subject: Mandatory Campus Fee for Computer Lab Paper—Humboldt State University—
Executive Order No 671

I am transmitting to you a copy of Executive Order No. 671 which authorizes at Humboldt State University the establishment of a mandatory campus fee for computer lab paper. Based upon a review of the consultation process employed by the campus and upon the results of the student fee referendum conducted in spring 1997, appropriate and meaningful consultation has occurred as required by Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06.

In accordance with policy of The California State University, the campus President has the responsibility for implementing Executive Orders where applicable and for maintaining the campus repository and index for all Executive Orders.


Title: Mandatory Campus Fee for Computer Lab Paper—Humboldt State University

Effective Date: July 14, 1997

Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective with the fall semester 1997, Humboldt State University is authorized to establish a mandatory campus fee for computer lab paper in the amount of \$5 per semester. Pursuant to Section 89724(a) of the Education Code, money received from this fee is appropriated for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature. Revenues received from this fee must be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the General Fund (Government Code Section 16300 *et seq.*).
