

**Subject:** Campus Mandatory Miscellaneous Course Fee for the Personal  
Water Craft/Jet Ski Program - Executive Order No. 680

I am transmitting to you a copy of Executive Order No. 680 which authorizes California State University, Sacramento to establish a campus mandatory miscellaneous course fee for the Personal Water Craft/Jet Ski Program. Based upon the recommendation of the Student Fee Advisory Committee, appropriate and meaningful consultation has occurred as required by the Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06. Executive Order No. 661 delegates authority to the president to adjust current campus mandatory fees when appropriate consultation has occurred.

In accordance with policy of The California State University, the campus president has the responsibility for implementing Executive Orders where applicable and for maintaining the campus repository and index for all Executive Orders.

**Title:** Campus Mandatory Miscellaneous Course Fee for  
Personal Water Craft/Jet Ski Program - California State  
University, Sacramento

**Effective Date:** February 27, 1998

**Supersedes:** No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective with the Fall term 1998, California State University, Sacramento is authorized to establish a campus mandatory miscellaneous course fee for the Personal Water Craft/Jet Ski Program in the amount of \$100 per student for each Fall and Spring term thereafter. Pursuant to section 89724(a) of the Education Code, money received from this fee is appropriated for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature. Revenues received from this fee must be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the General Fund (Government Code Section 16300 *et seq.*).
