



Subject: Executive Order No. 681 for a new Campus Penalty Fee

I am transmitting to you a copy of Executive Order No. 681 which authorizes California State University, Chico to establish new campus penalty fees for the music department library. Based upon a review of the consultation process employed by the campus and upon the recommendation of the Student Fee Advisory Committee, appropriate and meaningful consultation has occurred as required by the Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06.

In accordance with policy of The California State University, the campus president has the responsibility for implementing Executive Orders where applicable and for maintaining the campus repository and index for all Executive Orders.


Title: Campus Penalty Fees for the Music Department
Library, California State University, Chico

Effective Date: March 11, 1998

Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective with the Spring term 1998, California State University, Chico is authorized to establish a penalty fee for the music department library for printed materials and recordings in the amount of \$0.15 per day to a maximum of \$10 and for band and orchestra instruments in the amount of \$1.00 per day to a maximum of \$25.00. Pursuant to section 89724(a) of the Education Code, money received from this fee is appropriated for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature. Revenues received from this fee must be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the General Fund (Government Code Section 16300 *et seq.*).
