



**Subject:** Campus Mandatory Recreation Fee Executive Order No. 687

I am transmitting to you a copy of Executive Order No. 687, which authorizes California State University, San Marcos to establish a new campus Recreation Fee. Based upon a review of the results of the referendum employed by the campus and upon the recommendation of the Student Fee Advisory Committee, appropriate and meaningful consultation has occurred as required by the Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06.

In accordance with policy of The California State University, the campus president has the responsibility for implementing Executive Orders where applicable and for maintaining the campus repository and index for all Executive Orders.



This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective with the fall term 1998, California State University, San Marcos is authorized to establish a campus mandatory Recreation Fee in the amount of \$70 per academic year. Pursuant to section 89724(a) of the Education Code, money received from this fee is appropriated for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature. Revenues received from this fee shall be deposited into and maintained in local trust accounts in accordance with Education Code Section 89721(h).
