


Title: Campus User Fee: Service Enabling Device Fee

Effective Date: Winter Quarter 1999

Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective in winter 1999, California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo, is authorized to establish a new campus user fee: Service Enabling Device Fee. Service enabling devices are devices that are used to enable services being offered and may include such items as a parking meter key and parking permit hanger. The fee shall not include the cost of the service being offered. The fee amount for Service Enabling Devices will range from \$1 to \$20. Pursuant to section 89721(g) of the Education Code, monies collected from this fee may be deposited in local trust accounts and must be used solely to meet the costs of providing the services.
