

Subject: Executive Order No. 707 authorizing California State University,
Los Angeles, to establish a Student Health Services Fee

I am transmitting to you a copy of Executive Order No. 707, which authorizes California State University, Los Angeles to establish a new campus mandatory, Student Health Services Fee.

Regarding your request for future Student Health Services Fee adjustments, Executive Order 661 (fee policy) provides that campus presidents have the authority to adjust student fees after appropriate student consultation. Prior to adjustment of a campus mandatory fee, a student referendum is required. However, the president may use alternative consultation mechanisms if the president determines that a referendum is not the best mechanism to achieve appropriate and meaningful consultation.

In accordance with policy of The California State University, the campus president has the responsibility for implementing Executive Orders where applicable and for maintaining the campus repository and index for all Executive Orders.

Executive Order No.: 707
Title: Campus Mandatory Fee – Student Health Services
Effective Date: Fall Quarter 1999
Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective in fall quarter 1999, California State University, Los Angeles is authorized to establish a new campus mandatory fee for Student Health Services. The fee amount for this service is \$40 per quarter.

The new campus mandatory fee must be deposited in the General Fund of the State Treasury and is appropriated for the support of the University pursuant to Education Code Section 89724(a).
