

Humboldt State University has estimated the revenue expectation for summer term 2000 and, therefore, maintains responsibility for meeting its revenue goal without additional support from the CSU systemwide office.

In accordance with policy of the California State University, the campus president has the responsibility for implementing Executive Orders where applicable and for maintaining the campus repository and index for all Executive Orders.

Effective Date: Summer Term 2000


Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 07-99-08. Effective summer term 2000, Humboldt State University is authorized to establish the following summer term, State University Fee Schedule until further amended:

Humboldt State University's summer term, State University Fee rates may not exceed the maximum semester fee rates established by the California State University, Board of Trustees. The summer term, State University Fee must be deposited in the General Fund of the State Treasury and is appropriated for the support of the University pursuant to Education Code Section 89724(a).
