


Title: Campus User Fee: Orthotics and Prosthetics Program fee;
California State University, Dominguez Hills

Effective Date: November 22, 1999

Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89708, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective November 22, 1999, California State University, Dominguez Hills is authorized to establish a new campus user fee for the Orthotics and Prosthetics Program, a self-support Continuing Education program. The fee amount is \$416 per unit for 39 units offered during the two academic years of the Orthotics and Prosthetics Program. Pursuant to section 89704 of the Education Code, monies collected from this fee may be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the State University Continuing Education Revenue Fund. Instead of depositing monies from this fee in the State University Continuing Education Revenue Fund, monies collected from this fee may be deposited in a local trust account pursuant to section 89721(i) of the Education Code.
