

Title: Campus Penalty Fee: Enrollment Confirmation Deposit,
California State University, Chico


Effective Date: Fall Semester 2000

Supersedes: No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective fall semester 2000, California State University, Chico is authorized to establish a new campus penalty fee for Enrollment Confirmation Deposit. The Enrollment Confirmation Deposit fee amount is \$200 and will be held to confirm intention to enroll in a subsequent semester. Upon the student's registration, the deposit will be transferred to offset a portion of the student's State University Fee. If the student fails to enroll, the deposit will be forfeited and used to cover costs associated with the failure to enroll.

Pursuant to section 89724(a) of the Education Code, revenues from this fee shall be deposited in the State Treasury and credited to the General Fund for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature.
