



**Executive Order No.:** 727

**Title:** Campus user Uniform Fee, campus user Telephone Fee, campus penalty Damage Deposit Fee, and campus penalty Replacement of Lost Parking Permit Fee; California Maritime Academy

**Effective Date:** January 26, 2000

**Supersedes:** No Previous Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 05-96-06 and consonant with Executive Order No. 661.

Effective January 26, 2000, California Maritime Academy is authorized to establish the following fees: campus user Uniform Fee amount of \$1,300 charged to entering freshman; campus user Telephone Fee amount ranging from \$8 to \$50; penalty Damage Deposit Fee amount of \$150 charged to resident students at the beginning of the academic year; and penalty Replacement of Lost Parking Permit Fee amount of \$10.

Revenue from the above campus user fees may be deposited in a local trust account pursuant to Education Code Section 89721(g) and must be used solely to meet the costs of providing those materials and services. Revenue from the above campus penalty fees must be deposited in the General Fund in the State Treasury and is appropriated for the support of the University pursuant to Education Code Section 89724(a).
