Executive Order: 765

Title: Miscellaneous Course Fees related to Summer at Sea for Matriculated Students and Summer at Sea for Non-matriculated Students; California State University, Long Beach

Effective Date: Summer Term 2001

Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89708, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 03-04-00, and consonant with Executive Order Number 740.

Effective Summer Term 2001, California State University, Long Beach, University College and Extension Services is authorized to establish Category III, Miscellaneous Course Fees related to Summer at Sea for Matriculated Students at a fee range of \$2,975 to \$3,273 and Summer at Sea for Non-matriculated Students at a fee range of \$3,480 to \$3,828. The fees will cover costs of materials and services, room and board as part of courses.

Revenue collected from extension services fees may be deposited pursuant to Education Code Section 89704 in the State University Continuing Education Revenue Fund in the State Treasury. Alternatively, pursuant to Education Code Section 89721(i), revenue from extension services fees may be deposited in a local trust account. In either case, the fee revenues and interest earnings therefrom are appropriated for the support and development of self-instructional programs of the California State University.
