

Executive Order: 778

Title: Family and Consumer Sciences Dietetic Internship Application Processing Fee; California State University, Long Beach

Effective Date: May 29, 2001

Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 03-04-00, and consonant with Executive Order Number 740.

Effective May 29, 2001, California State University, Long Beach is authorized to establish a Category III, Family and Consumer Sciences Dietetic Internship Application Processing Fee at a fee range of \$45 to \$49.

Pursuant to Section 89724(a) of the Education Code, revenue collected from this fee shall be deposited in the State Treasury and credited to the General Fund for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature.
