Title: Testing Fee and Technology Competency Challenge Exam Fee;
Humboldt State University


Effective Date: May 29, 2001

Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Education Code Section 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Section 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 03-04-00, and consonant with Executive Order Number 740.

Effective May 29, 2001, Humboldt State University is authorized to establish a Category III, Testing Fee and a Category III, Technology Competency Challenge Exam Fee. The Testing Fee is established at a fee rate of \$3 and will cover the cost of proctoring, scoring, and processing a variety of tests. The Technology Competency Challenge Exam Fee is established at a fee range of \$40 to \$50 and will cover the costs of proctoring and scoring the exam, reporting results to the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing, and maintaining the record-keeping system of challenge test results.

Pursuant to Section 89724(a) of the Education Code, revenue collected from these fees shall be deposited in the State Treasury and credited to the General Fund for the support of the university in addition to such other amounts as may be appropriated therefor by the Legislature.
