Title: Campus-based Fees for System Study Abroad Program

This executive order is issued pursuant to authority granted by Board of Trustees Resolution Number REP 03-96-04 and excuses students participating in the CSU Systemwide International Programs (IP) from having to pay campus-based fees covering campus services which they cannot receive.
