Executive Order: 810

Title: Continuing Education Global News Media/Brazil Tour Course Fee, and Miscellaneous Course Fee for Art Department Courses with Art Life Models; California State University, Long Beach

Effective Date: February 15, 2002

Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued under the authority granted by Education Code Sections 89700 and 89708, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Sections 1, 2, and 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 03-04-00, and consonant with Executive Order Number 740.

Effective February 15, 2002, California State University, Long Beach is authorized to establish a Category III, Continuing Education Global News Media/Brazil Tour Course Fee, and a Category III, Miscellaneous Course Fee for Art Department Courses with Art Life Models. The Continuing Education Global News Media/Brazil Tour Course Fee is established at a fee range of \$1,642 to \$1,888 and will cover the cost of Brazil tour transportation, lodging, tours, and meals. The Miscellaneous Course Fee for Art Department Courses with Art Life Models is established at a fee range of \$48 to \$55 and will cover the cost to hire life models in classes requiring life models drawing, painting, and sculpturing.

Revenue collected from continuing education fees may be deposited in the State University Continuing Education Revenue Fund in the State Treasury (Education Code Section 89704). Alternatively, the revenue from continuing education fees may be deposited in a local trust account (Education Code Section 89721(i)). In either case, the fee revenues are appropriated for the support and development of self-support instructional programs of the California State University. Revenue collected from miscellaneous course fees are to be deposited either in the General Fund or in a local trust account, depending on the nature of the fee. As required by Education Code Section 89721(g), revenue collected may be deposited in a local trust account where the fee is required of those persons who, at their option, use the services or facilities, or are provided the materials, for which the fee is collected. In other words, if the student has the option to procure the services, facilities, or materials for which the fee is charged on the open market or some other way separate from the university and still fulfill the requirements of the university course, the revenue may be deposited in trust.
