

Title: Category III, Supplemental Fees for Off Campus, Self-Support Programs;
California State University, Northridge


Effective Date: July 15, 2002

Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order

This Executive Order is issued under the authority granted by Education Code Sections 89035, 89708, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Sections 1, 2 and 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 03-04-00, and consonant with Executive Order No. 740.

Effective July 15, 2002, California State University, Northridge is authorized to establish Category III, Supplemental Fees for Off Campus, Self-Support Programs. The fee will cover costs such as space rental, mode of delivery, library support, on-site student services, and academic support. The fee is established at a range of \$105 to \$265 per credit hour.

In accordance with Education Code Sections 89704 and 89721(i), revenue collected from these fees may be deposited either in the State University Continuing Education Revenue Fund in the State Treasury or in a local trust account.
