

Executive Order: 989
Effective Date: August 22, 2006
Supersedes: No Prior Executive Order
Title: Miscellaneous Course Fee for ArtS 400, Art in the Classroom; Sonoma State University

This executive order is issued under the authority granted by Education Code Sections 89035 and 89700, Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees, Chapter III, Sections 1, 2 and 6-f-1, and Board of Trustees' Resolution RFIN 03-04-00, and consonant with Executive Order Number 740.

Effective August 22, 2006, Sonoma State University is authorized to establish a Category III, Miscellaneous Course Fee for ArtS 400, Art in the Classroom. The course fee for ArtS 400 is established at a fee rate of \$30, and will allow the college to buy art supplies and materials in bulk for students preparing projects for teaching art to elementary and high school students.

In accordance with Education Code Section 89721(1), revenue collected from all higher education fees shall be deposited in a local trust unless otherwise specified.
