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Introduction

This report presents information on the recruitment of tenure track faculty at the twenty-three campuses of the California State University (CSU). The report focuses on searches conducted for openings available in Fall 2006, but also considers some data from prior years. It is based on survey information that the Office of the Chancellor has collected from the campuses since 1988 to provide the CSU with information about the successes and difficulties encountered in recruiting tenure track faculty.

This year the report is presented in a new streamlined format divided into an executive summary and a compendium of data displays. The data are organized into the following five sections:

Executive Summary

1. Searches Attempted and Completed.

In 2006, 1,141 searches were attempted, resulting in 882 appointments. The number of searches and appointments this year continued an upward trend after several years of decreases due to budget. The success rate increased with 77% of new tenure track faculty searches resulting in appointment.

2. Applications.

The campuses with the highest number of average applications per search were Channel Islands (62), Humboldt (55), Monterey Bay (52), and San Marcos (51). The campuses with the lowest averages were Maritime Academy (9), Chico (20), and Bakersfield (22).

Disciplines with the highest number of applications per search were Math/Computer Science (73), Letters (64), and Business/Management (46). The disciplines with the lowest number of applications were Health Sciences (6), Agriculture (11), and Family/Consumer Sciences (11).

3. Success Rates (# Searches / # Appointments).

Among the campuses, San Luis Obispo completed the highest percentage of its searches (90%). Other campuses with high success rates included Long Beach (88%) and Northridge (88%). The lowest campus success rate was at Channel Islands (48%) followed by Dominguez Hills (53%).

All 11 searches systemwide in Family/Consumer Sciences were completed, for a success rate of 100%. By contrast, the least successful disciplines were Business/Management, Agriculture, and Health Sciences all with success rates of 69%.

Note: Factors that may influence a campus's overall success rate include the specific disciplines for which recruitments are being conducted. As can be seen in Display 7, both the number of applications and success rates can vary widely across disciplines as well as in sub-disciplines within disciplines.

4. Unsuccessful Searches.

The most cited reason (39%) for unsuccessful searches (i.e., those 259 searches that were conducted but did not result in appointments) was “inadequate candidate pool.” The second most commonly cited reason (28%) was that all offers to candidates were declined.

5. Starting Salaries.

The average salary of new tenure track faculty (all ranks) went up by 5.6%, from \$61,087 in 2005 to \$64,538 in 2006. The average salary of new assistant professors went up by 4.9%, from \$58,453 in 2005 to \$61,310 in 2006.

The highest average salaries (all ranks) were at Dominguez Hills (\$76,269), Channel Islands (\$76,023), and San Diego (\$73,226).

The lowest average salaries (all ranks) were at Humboldt (\$56,633), Chico (\$57,079), and Sacramento (\$57,639).

The highest average disciplinary salary was for Business/Management (\$81,315), while the lowest was for Fine Arts (\$55,867).

There was considerable variation in the range of starting salaries (from \$45,156 to \$105,000) offered to new Assistant Professors from different academic disciplines (and, in some cases, within disciplines). 6. Start-Up Awards and Other New Faculty Support.

The average start-up package (including laboratory/office equipment, professional travel, and other funds, whether from state or non-state sources) offered to new tenure track faculty was \$11,408. New faculty members in the Natural Sciences received the greatest average start-up funding (approximately \$69,000 per individual receiving funding). Systemwide, nearly 78% of new tenure track faculty in 2006 were offered some form of reduction of teaching workload for the first year. The average reimbursement for moving expenses was \$2,658 (\$4,049 for those actually receiving reimbursement). Out of the 882 new faculty hired for Fall 2006, 25% received some form of tenure or service credit as part of their recruitment package.

7. New Faculty Preparation and Experience.

The majority of new tenure track faculty (61%) earned their highest degree between 2000 and 2006. An additional 10% of new faculty were appointed without having completed the doctorate (“ABD”). Family/Consumer Sciences (27%) and Business/Management (20%) were the disciplines with the highest relative proportions of “ABD” new hires.

8. Diversity.

New tenure track faculty appointments were split roughly evenly between men and women, consistent with a more than ten-year trend.

When considering all appointments, including those of other/unknown ethnicities, minorities represented 30% of total appointments. If the category of other/unknown is excluded, minorities represented 34% of new hires. Among minorities, Asians comprised the largest group at 18.3% of appointments.

Three out of the four new appointments at California Maritime Academy went to minority faculty. Other campuses with relatively high percentages of minority

hires were Los Angeles (59%), and San Francisco (54%). Humboldt (10%) and San Luis Obispo (11%) reported the lowest proportions of new minority hires.

Disciplines varied greatly in the proportion of new appointments going to minorities, ranging from a high of 46% (Letters) to a low of 6% (Agriculture). A full breakdown by disciplines is provided in Display 23.

Display 30 shows the variation by discipline and sub-discipline for new hires with respect to gender and ethnicity.

9. Sources of New Faculty.

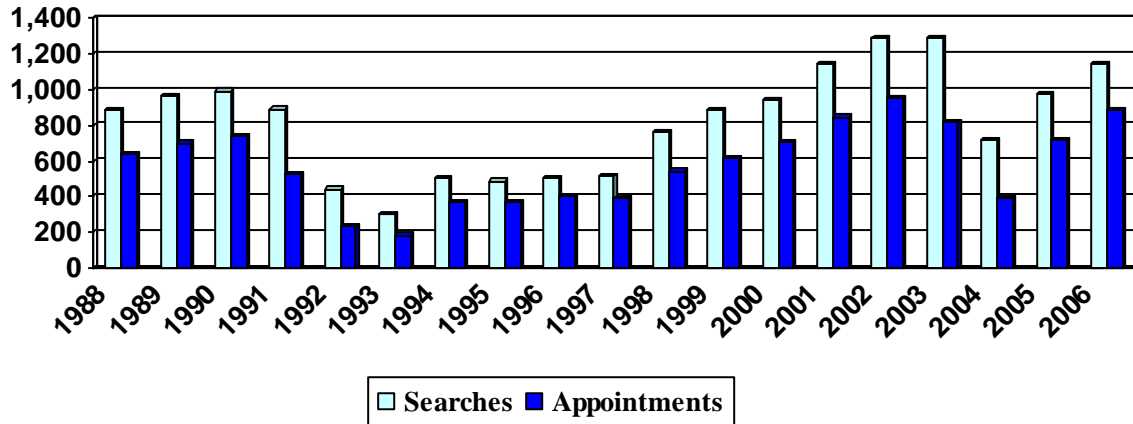
CSU campuses recruit faculty from a broad range of institutions and geographical areas (see Display 29). 19% of new faculty were recruited from within the CSU system; about 12% were previously employed as lecturers by the campus where they were hired, and almost 7% were employed by other CSU campuses (although it was unknown whether they were employed in lecturer, tenure track, or non-instructional positions). For those new tenure track faculty previously employed in higher education and outside the CSU, 72% came from institutions outside of California. 24% of appointments made in the Health Sciences were for individuals formerly in campus lecturer positions. 25% of Maritime Academy appointments and 24% of Bakersfield appointments were for former campus lecturers.

10. Non-Reappointments, Tenure Denials, and Resignations.

It appears that overall the CSU was highly successful in retaining faculty. CSU campuses reported 235 resignations by tenured or probationary faculty members in 2005-2006, or 2.3% of all CSU tenured and probationary faculty. The resignation category does not include retirements, non-reappointments, tenure denials, and terminal year appointments. Of the resignations, 166, or 71%, were by probationary faculty. The total number of resignations remained the same compared to 2005.

One percent of probationary faculty were denied reappointment or tenure during 2005-2006. Twelve campuses reported no non-reappointments or tenure denials and two campuses, East Bay and San Marcos, reported no resignations.

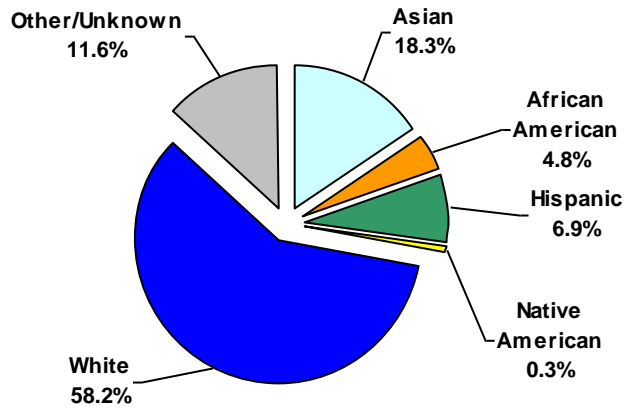

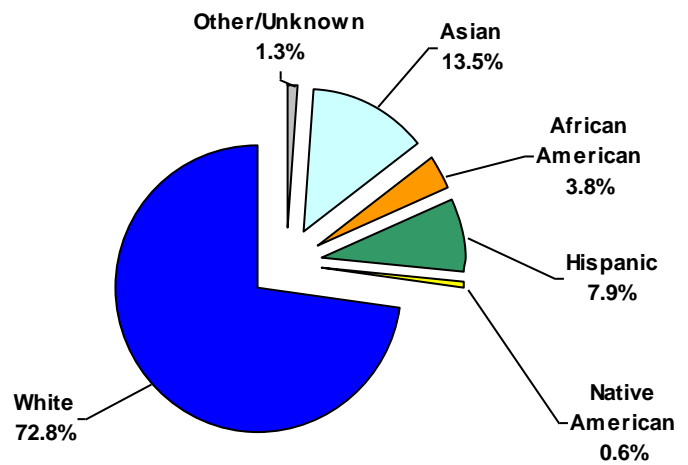
