**INTRODUCTION**

California State University Trustee Stanley T. Wang established **The Wang Family Scholarship** on 9 November 2000. The fund “is to provide an opportunity for students to prepare for a role in the international business world. Recognizing the increasing importance of international education and economic globalization, the Wang Family seeks to provide students and faculty members an opportunity for learning in an international environment and culture.” Scholarships and stipends awarded from the fund “shall be used for the specific purpose of supporting study, teaching and research abroad for students and faculty members in the Republic of China (Taiwan) and in the People’s Republic of China through the California State University.”

**The Wang Family Scholarship** fund is established to provide an opportunity to talented and distinguished faculty and students who will profit from an international learning experience and use this knowledge to contribute to business and personal relations between the United States, the Republic of China (Taiwan) and the People’s Republic of China. The scholarship recognizes the financial limitations of potential participants and will provide an opportunity to experience the possibilities of the global market.

**FACULTY STIPENDS**

The faculty component of The Wang Family Scholarship will provide four ten thousand dollar (\$10,000) stipends to be awarded annually for a period of ten years. The faculty stipends of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) are designated to be used for research or teaching at the National Taiwan University in the Republic of China (Taiwan), the National Tsinghua University in the Republic of China (Taiwan), Peking University in Beijing, and Jiao Tung University in Shanghai. Successful applicants may be involved in both research and teaching at their host universities. It is expected that the funded activity (research or teaching) will be the primary focus of the successful applicant.

**ELIGIBILITY FOR FACULTY STIPENDS**

1. Full-time tenured or tenure track faculty appointment at a CSU campus with Ph.D. or appropriate terminal degree
2. Any rank
3. Teaching applicants must have a formal invitation from one of the designated universities
4. Former Wang recipients are not eligible to reapply.

### **APPLICATION**

Complete application packet will include:

1. Completed cover sheet (attach the signed cover page to your application packet)
2. Letter of Application addressed to the Screening Committee (one page maximum, single side, 12 pitch font minimum)
3. Curriculum Vitae (two pages maximum, single side, 12 pitch font minimum)
4. Description of Proposed Research/Teaching Proposal to include (limit two pages maximum; single side, 12 pitch font minimum):
  - a. Abstract. Give a concise statement of the proposal, including methodology. Note that reviewers may not have a background in your field, so try to keep discipline-specific technical terms and concepts (including mathematical formulae) to a minimum and do not use undefined acronyms or abbreviations.
  - b. Research/Teaching Proposal. Give an overview of the research/teaching proposal that clearly shows your proposal. Explain the necessity of conducting your research/teaching at the specific proposed location. Also state the timeline leading to completion this project.
  - c. Significance. Please state and justify the importance/significance of your project and how it relates to the purpose of the Wang Faculty Stipend.
  - d. Outcomes. State clearly the anticipated outcomes of your proposal, including plans for future extra mural support and dissemination.
5. Two letters of recommendation from persons qualified to evaluate your proposal.
6. Letter of support from your department chair or dean.

### **REVIEW AND EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS**

The Faculty Affairs Committee of the CSU Academic Council on International Programs (ACIP) will review all applications and recommend recipients to the Academic Affairs Division of the California State University, Office of the Chancellor.

### **CALENDAR AND APPLICATION PROCESS**

Stipends are awarded for research projects and teaching assignments occurring between September 1 and August 31 of the following year. The project should be completed within a year of receiving the award. Funds may be used for any expenses directly related to the research project or teaching assignment. You will be required to track expenses. The deadline for receipt in the Office of the Chancellor of all application materials, including references, is **December 1**. Review of applications will take place during February. Announcement of recipients will normally be made by **May 1**.
