The Program in Denmark

Denmark's capital, Copenhagen, was founded in 1167 and has been the home of Danish kings and queens since the 1400s. As a result, the city is graced with an array of towers, castles, and parks. The spirit of the royal city has been maintained with many well-preserved buildings, old winding streets, and open squares. It is a sophisticated yet friendly city, the center of national politics and culture, which offers entertainment from the famous Royal Ballet to Tivoli Gardens.

Programs are offered in **Architecture and Design**, and **Psychology and Child Development**.

The academic program is arranged by Denmark's International Study Program (DIS), an affiliate of the University of Copenhagen. DIS offers instruction in English to approximately 1,000 visiting international students each year. In addition to providing the academic program, DIS arranges housing, organizes field trips, and offers personal assistance to students as necessary. The faculty from DIS is drawn from both higher education and the professional community in Denmark. While lectures are conducted in English, all CSU students study Danish throughout the year as an integral feature of the CSU International Programs. BENEFITS

- Students earn regular CSU resident credit for all coursework abroad.
- International Programs is supported by the state of California. Student fees cover a portion of the cost.
- International Programs assists in international arrangements including academic planning, transportation, visas, housing and other matters.
- Once abroad, students receive assistance from CSU resident staff and/or host institution staff.

FINANCIAL AID

All campus financial aid is applicable except work-study.

ELIGIBILITY

- Enrollment at a CSU campus not later than spring term 2009 or eligibility to enter from a California community college by fall term 2010.
- A cumulative GPA of 2.75 for all higher education work by the application deadline. Students with a GPA below the stipulated level will be considered when special circumstances exist.
- Upper-division standing by the end of spring term 2010.

- Graduate students are not eligible.

• ARCHITECTURE

- Enrollment in the architecture program at Cal Poly Pomona or Cal Poly San Luis Obispo.
- Favorable recommendation by the architecture faculty at your home campus.

• PSYCHOLOGY AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT

- Completion of lower-division requirements in child development, liberal studies, psychology, social work, or a closely related field.

How to Apply

Your Campus Coordinator (see below) will provide you with additional information about the online application. Complete your application by February 1. You will be interviewed on campus, and the committee's recommendation will be forwarded to the central Office of International Programs. A statewide committee makes final recommendations, and you will be notified of the results in early April.
