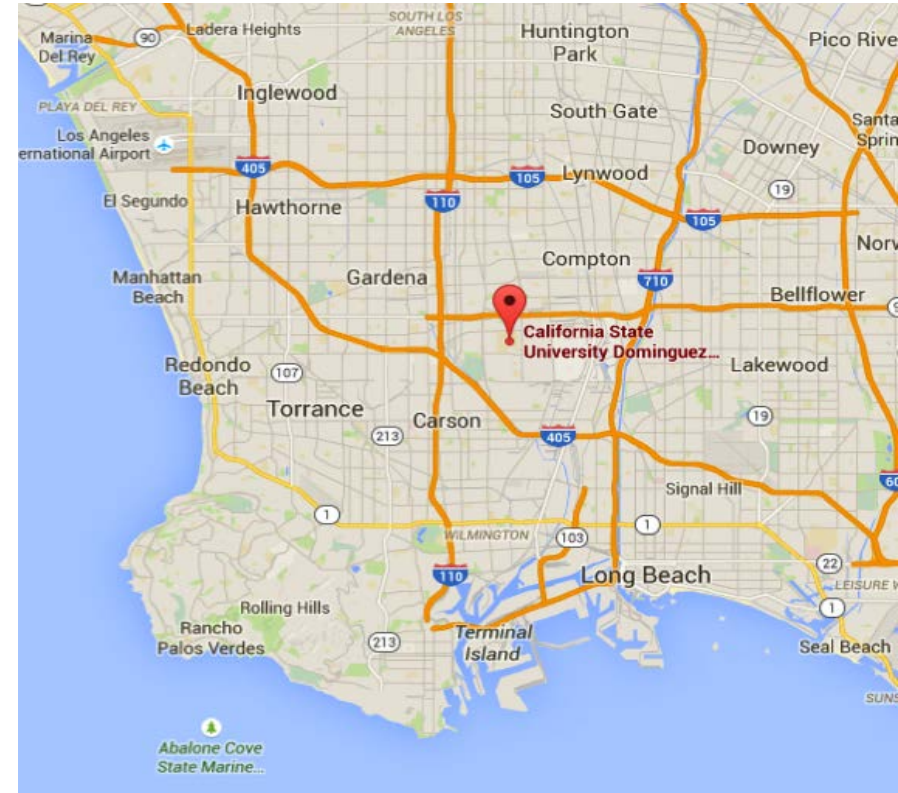

October 1:	CSUDH applications open at CSUMentor.edu
November 30:	Deadline to file your priority application
January 1:	Apply for financial aid at fafsa.gov
February 15:	Deadline for submitting missing application documents
March 2:	Deadline for priority financial aid consideration
May 1:	Deadline to submit your Intent to Enroll at MyCSUDH.EDU
May 7:	Deadline to take the ELM/EPT
May 12:	Deadline to submit financial aid documents
June 1:	Register for NSO
July 15:	Deadline for final official transcripts showing graduation date
August 20:	Fall classes begin

Deadlines must be met in order to remain eligible for enrollment.

Early Start Program

All incoming first time freshman who do not demonstrate readiness for college level English and/or math courses are required to enroll in an Early Start Summer Course to begin working on remediation prior to the start of Fall semester.
