Graduation Initiative 2025

- Hired 11 **Graduation and Retention Specialists** who will focus on increasing freshmen retention and undergraduate graduation rates.
- **Data Champions** - brings together key faculty and staff throughout the university in an effort to facilitate data-informed decision making about how CSUN can better support student success in each academic college
- **30 to Thrive/Student Success Advertising Campaign** – changing the mind set of students to take 30 units per semester to increase opportunity to graduate in four years
- **The California Promise Program**
 - Two-year degree pledge program for entering students who hold an Associate's Degree for Transfer (ADT) to complete their remaining requirements for a baccalaureate degree.
 - priority registration
 - students must meet with their advisors as prescribed, develop an enrollment plan
 - complete 30 semester units within each academic year.
