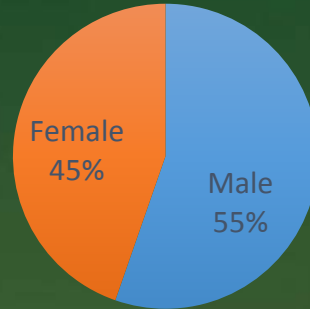

Cal Poly Pomona's Campus-Wide Goals



Using **data dashboards** to identify students who are closest to graduation and provide additional support.



Providing **additional funding** to open bottleneck courses.



Using **degree audits and analytic tools** to align class schedule with student demand.



Addressing and reducing the number of courses with high failure rates with redesign.



Executing **targeted interventions** to students who are at risk of derailing their paths to graduation.



Expanding **support for student programs** aimed at eliminating the equity gaps.

At Cal Poly Pomona, student success is the motivation behind our short- and long-term planning. Student success drives course planning, programming, and resource development. Student Success is the foundation of our campus strategic planning process.

Among other strategies, we work with students during their senior year through the Early Assessment Program. During the summer between senior year and fall, we work with students through the Early Start Program and New Student Orientation. Our First Year Experience, Learning Resource Center, The Bronco Advising Center, University Advising, CPP Pledge & California Promise Programs, and the College-Based Student Success teams collaborate and work with students to ensure that students are supported in earning their baccalaureate degrees.
