

California State University, San Bernardino

Contribution Highlights:

- The planned gift program has definitely come of age, with the campus securing its two largest gifts—an anonymous planned gift valued at \$21 million and a \$12 million planned gift from the family of CSU San Bernardino’s first president, John M. Pfau.
- The Bernard Osher Foundation awarded two \$1 million grants: one for the Re-entry program and one for Lifelong Learning. Both grants support intellectual development for older adults.
- The campus secured over \$1 million for the Equal Opportunity Program Foster Youth Program, including \$656,000 from a planned gift, \$217,196 from a local organization, \$150,000 from a foundation and the remainder from small gifts, exemplifying wide support for the program.
- The Palm Desert campus raised \$825,025 for its third building, completing the new campus without state funding.

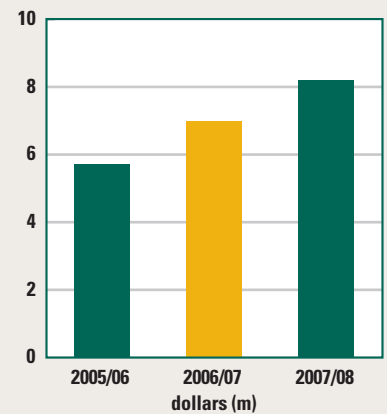

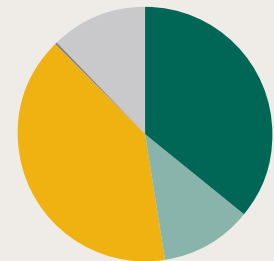

Charitable Gifts: A 3-Year History

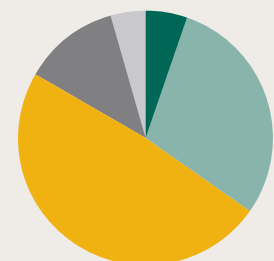


Charitable Gifts by Gift Disbursement
