Contribution Highlights:

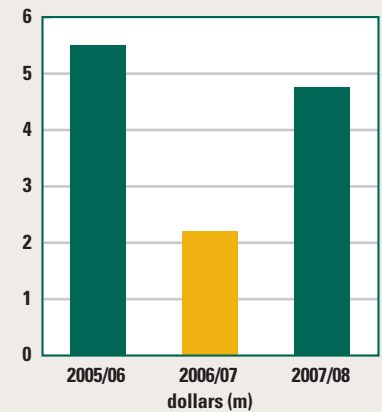
- The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute received over \$1 million from the Bernard Osher Foundation to provide mature learners with an intellectually challenging program of non-credit courses taught by CSU San Marcos professors and other field experts.
- First-time corporate givers funded science research and equipment important to the development of a quality workforce to support industry innovation.
- The number of donors significantly increased through the creation of unique athletic fundraising appeals, such as the 300-hole Golf Tournament and 100-Mile Relay.
- College-based advisory boards were established to broaden the university's connection to the community and industry.

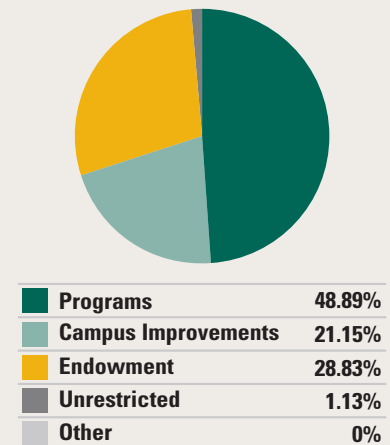
