

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SACRAMENTO

- The largest estate gift in CSU Sacramento's history—\$2.6 million from the David B. Steinberg Family Trust—will support the Voula Steinberg Memorial Mathematics Programs Fund in the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics, encouraging students to pursue careers teaching mathematics.
- A \$500,000 gift from the Frank M. and Gertrude R. Doyle Foundation will fund state-of-the-art technology, including computerized mannequins for the Division of Nursing's expansion and relocation to Folsom Hall.
- The Wachovia Wells Fargo Foundation contributed over \$180,000 to fund several CSU Sacramento programs, including the Guardian Scholars program for former foster youth, the Honors Program and the One Book Program, as well to promote the campus's Destination 2010 initiative. Over the past five years, Wells Fargo has contributed half a million dollars to the university.
- Alumnus Angelo K. Tsakopoulos made his annual \$25,000 gift to fund the Anthony J. and Soula Leones Scholarship program, which benefits 25 low-income, first-generation and farm worker family students each year.
- The Computer Science Department in the College of Engineering and Computer Science received a \$34,676 gift-in-kind from Intel Corporation.
- The William and Flora Hewlett Foundation provided \$250,000 in funding to support the Institute for Higher Education Leadership and Policy and more than \$400,000 for the Brokers of Enterprise project with the California Department of Education. Since 2006, the foundation has given nearly \$2 million to CSU Sacramento.

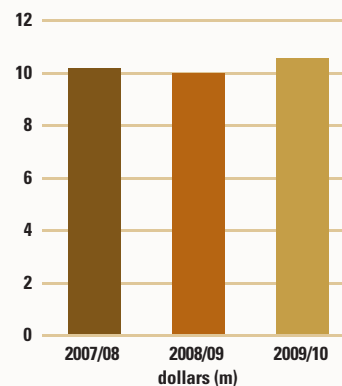

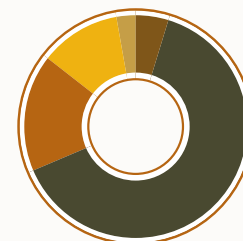

CHARITABLE GIFTS: A 3-YEAR HISTORY

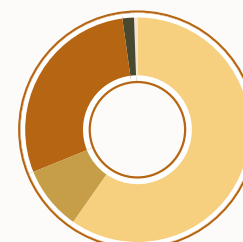


CHARITABLE GIFTS BY SOURCE OF GIFT
