
ABOUT US

Cal State Apply - <u>calstate.edu/apply</u> October 1 – December 15

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- High school graduate or completed GED
- A-G requirements met with grades of C- or higher

<u>FALL 2022 UPDATES</u> – Visit <u>CSU website</u> for all updates

 The California State University (CSU) will temporarily suspend the use of ACT/SAT examinations in determining admission eligibility for all CSU campuses.

IMPACTION

- Impacted Majors: Biological Sciences, Biotechnology, Business, Electrical Engineering, Kinesiology, Nursing, Software Engineering
- The GPA requirement will be higher for Non-LSA applicants

LOCAL SERVICE AREA FOR FRESHMAN

HOW TO APPLY

Cal State Apply - <u>calstate.edu/apply</u> October 1 – December 15

<u>UPPER-DIVISION TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS</u>

- Have completed a minimum of 60 semester or 90 quarter units of transferable units by the end of spring 2022.
- Earned a cumulative transfer GPA of 2.0 or higher
- In good standing at the last institution of attendance
- Completed an <u>Associate's Degree for Transfer</u> in a major deemed similar Or,
- Completed the CSU General Education Transfer Pattern
 - Golden Four Basic Skills (one course in each area: oral communication, written communication, critical thinking, and mathematics/quantitative reasoning).
- Completed all Major Preparation courses
- Completed all fall admission requirements by end of the preceding spring term. Courses completed in summer will not be considered for fall admission.

IMPACTION

- Impacted Majors: Biological Sciences, Biotechnology, Business, Electrical Engineering, Kinesiology, Nursing, Software Engineering
- Non-LSA (Out-of-Area) transfer students are welcome to apply and be considered if enrollment space is available after local service area applicants.




CSUSM Scholarship Application

NOVEMBER - APRIL

Rolling admission notifications sent via email and student portal, MyCSUSM

FEBRUARY 15

Initial document deadline. Transfers must submit all official transcripts, including those with fall term grades if applicable.

APRIL

Cougar Blue Days - our annual open house event for newly admitted students

MAY 1

Deadline to submit Intent to Enroll and non-refundable \$150 deposit

JULY 15

Deadline for receipt of final official transcripts with spring term grades.

FRESHMAN STUDENTS

- A-G Courses As a first-time freshman applicant you must complete, with grades of C or higher, the 15-unit comprehensive pattern of college preparatory courses.
- <u>University of California's Course List Search</u>-Please refer to the UC course list search for the entire listing of approved courses
- <u>CSU Grade Point Average Calculator</u> Estimate your GPA

TRANSFER STUDENTS

- <u>ASSIST.org-</u> is recommended to determine transferability of courses taken at California Community Colleges
- <u>Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)</u>- The Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act (SB 1440) allows California Community College students to have a clear pathway to a CSU degree major.
- <u>CSUSM Course Catalog</u> offers listings of the most current courses available at Cal State San Marcos
- <u>Transfer Evaluation System (TES)</u>- College Source is an interactive resource for researching transfer credit, tracking evaluations, and managing equivalencies from institutions of higher education.
