

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF RESOLUTIONS ACADEMIC SENATE CSU PLENARY – MAY 10-11 2018

The Academic Senate CSU (ASCSU) met at the Chancellor's Office in Long Beach on May 10-11, 2018 and approved the following resolutions. All can be accessed at the [ASCSU website](#).

AS-3321-18/EX (Rev)

Academic Senate of the CSU Calendar of 2018-2019 Meetings

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU adopted the proposed calendar showing its 2018-2019 meeting schedule.

AS-3322-18/AA (Rev)

Endorsement of "White Paper on Student Success"

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU recognizes that graduation rates and time to graduation should not be used as the primary measure of student success. The ASCSU endorses the "*White Paper on Student Success*," which presents the myriad dimensions of student success and focuses on faculty-student interaction as a critical component of such success.

AS-3323-18/FA (Rev)

Concerning the Influence of Outside Groups on Curriculum Development in the California State University (CSU)

Approved Without Dissent

The ASCSU urges CSU administrators to resist efforts by outside groups to enact systemwide curricular changes over CSU faculty decisions and requests that the Chancellor's Office provide CSU faculty with an accounting of the sources of any stakeholder involvement in its future curriculum proposals.

Additionally, the ASCSU reaffirms that curricular proposals should be initiated by the faculty and that when exceptions occur, the Chancellor's Office provide CSU faculty justification for its proposals. The ASCSU also requests that the Chancellor's Office provide ample time for faculty to review and provide possible revisions of future curriculum recommendations.

AS-3324-18/APEP (Rev)

Equity and Responsibility in Admissions to the Distinctive Universities and Campuses of the California State University System

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU endorses practices that give an admission advantage to applicants from the local admission areas of the individual campuses while balancing the ability for other students from outside the local region to attend “out of local area” campuses and programs. Further, the ASCSU urges the CSU to resist efforts of those who intentionally or unintentionally undermine the CSU commitment to inclusive excellence for all potential CSU students, as manifested in CSU commitments, to serve a diverse student body.

AS-3325-18/AA (Rev)

State University Grant Program: A Call for Full Funding From the State

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU encourages the California Legislature, the Governor of California, the CSU Board of Trustees, and the CSU Chancellor’s Office to work in concert to ensure that the State of California resume its responsibility for fully funding the State University Grant (SUG) program.

AS-3326-18/FA (Rev)

Protecting CSU Students and Employees From Attacks by Outside Groups

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU resolves that the Chancellor’s Office shall appoint an ad hoc committee of faculty, staff, administration, and students to draft a policy for coordinating responses to circumstances where CSU students or employees come under attack for their professional work or political stances.

AS-3327-18/FA (Rev)

Appreciation for the American Association of University Professors’ (AAUP) Support of Shared Governance at the California State University (CSU)

Approved Without Dissent

The ASCSU expresses its appreciation for the efforts of the AAUP and the California Council of the AAUP (CA-AAUP) in its advocacy of shared governance in higher education, acknowledges receipt of the letters from those organizations concerning the governance process surrounding the development of Executive Orders (EO) 1100 (rev) and 1110, and welcomes continued AAUP monitoring of shared governance practices within the CSU.

AS-3329-18/EX

Commemoration of the 1968 Student Strikes for Relevant Education

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU honors the legacy of the 1968 strikers at San Francisco State University and other CSU campuses, their struggles, and the active agency taken in their educational careers to the benefit of all.

AS-3330-18/AA/APEP

Funding the English Council Professional Development Plan to Implement Executive Order (EO) 1110

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU urges the CSU Chancellor's Office to allocate additional professional development resources to fully fund the May 2018 English Council Professional Development Plan in order to implement the policies of EO 1110.

AS-3331-18/EX

In Support of the Advancement of Ethnic Studies in the California State University

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU affirms both its support for the work of the Ethnic Studies Task Force and its long-standing commitment to advancing and supporting ethnic studies within the CSU. It also urges campuses to include Ethnic Studies major and minor options in advising materials, student orientations, and on campus websites. In addition, it urges the Chancellor to reinstate the moratorium on any actions that may have a negative impact on Ethnic Studies through academic year 2019-2020 to allow programs time to adapt to the effects of EO 1100 (rev) and EO 1110.

AS-3332-18/APEP

Assessing Outcomes Stemming From Changes in Academic Preparation Driven by Executive Order 1110 (August 2017)

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU requests that the *Implementation and Outcome Studies on Recent CSU Policy Changes Related to Academic Preparation* (WestEd), or a parallel effort, assess the effects of the changes to academic preparation on achievement of student learning outcomes.

AS-3333-18/EX/AA

Commendation for Dr. Christine Mallon

Approved by Acclamation

The ASCSU thanks Dr. Christine Mallon for her 15 years of dedicated service to the CSU and wishes her success in her new career as Vice President of Instruction at Stanbridge University.

AS-3334-18/FLOOR

Appreciation for Conversations on System Level Shared Governance in the CSU

Approved Unanimously

The ASCSU expresses its admiration and appreciation for the efforts of the ASCSU Executive Committee and members of the Chancellor’s Office leadership team that produced the “Tenets of System Level Shared Governance of the California State University” document, and urges the 2018-2019 ASCSU to take up the document as an agenda item during Fall 2018. The ASCSU encourages the 2018-2019 Executive Committee, and the ASCSU generally, to continue collaborative discussions on shared governance with the Chancellor’s Office.

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The following resolution was introduced for First Reading consideration. It died with the adjournment of the 2017-2018 Academic Senate after failing to receive the necessary first reading waiver to move it to second reading.
