#### 1. AS-3596-23/APEP (Rev)

Approved Unanimously

### **Endorsing Faculty Collaboration in the Development of the PK-3 Early Childhood Education Specialist Credential**

The California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) recently authorized a new PK-3 credential program. CSU campuses will be developing new credential programs that meet the CTC standards. Faculty, especially from early childhood education, must lead the development of these programs with consultation and collaboration with faculty in related disciplines.

### CSU Discipline Council Involvement in California Community College Course Review

When California Community College courses need review by faculty —for example, in GE certification or Associates Degree for Transfer course review— discipline councils, where they exist, should be called on to provide input or suggest suitable reviewers.

#### **Encouraging Campus Faculty Legislative Liaisons**

Requests campus Senates create a campus faculty Legislative Liaison position who would work jointly with the ASCSU Legislative Specialists, ASCSU Fiscal and Governmental Affairs Committee, and the Chancellor's Advocacy and State Relations office to increase campus understanding of and involvement in advocacy efforts.

#### 4. AS-3610-23/AA/FA (Rev)

### Renewing the Call for a Working Group in Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Higher Education

Artificial Intelligence (AI) creates a number of challenges for the CSU and its mission. In 2019, the ASCSU called for the establishment of a system-level working group to assess the impact AI might have on the employment landscape, particularly for jobs in the "knowledge economy" in which most of our graduates will begin their careers. This resolution renews that call and adds an additional charge: that the working group also consider AI's impact on teaching and learning.

#### 6. AS-3612-23/AA (Rev)

### California's Future Economic Strength Depends on Investing in Public Graduate Education Today

Approved

Urges recognition that the State's economic strength depends on investing in graduate education (both masters and doctoral levels). Calls for policies to ensure that graduate education retains academic excellence and remains competitive in attracting students. Requests an ASCSU/CSU Task Force on Graduate Education in the CSU.

## On the Process of Identifying and Resolving Issues of Duplication of CSU programs in AB 927 California Community College 4-year Baccalaureate Programs

The Chancellor's Office has worked collaboratively with the ASCSU in dealing with the 4-year baccalaureate programs proposed by California Community Colleges as allowed by AB 927. This resolution thanks the CO for its efforts in shared governance in this regard, and urges that it continue to work collaboratively with the ASCSU in future rounds of AB 927 program proposals.

#### 8. <u>AS-3614-23/JEDI/FA (Rev)</u>

Approved

### Solidarity with Immunocompromised, Caregivers, and ASCSU Members with Disabilities

Addresses the blaming, shaming, and guilt being directed towards ASCSU senators who are immunocompromised, disabled, and caregivers of people which makes them unable to attend in-person meetings because they are dealing with physical

challenges that make them vulnerable to contracting COVID-19 and other contagious severe diseases. It stresses the importance of continuing the support we created and implemented during the pandemic while enhancing our community of care.

#### 9. AS-3615-23/AA (Rev)

Approved Unanimously

#### On the Separation of CSU GE Breadth from Cal-GETC

Clarifies that CSU GE Breadth and the new Cal-GETC transfer curriculum are completely separate. While California Code of Regulation, 40405.2. "Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum" must be changed to comply with the law (AB 928), there is no mandate to alter 40405.1. "California State University General Education--Breadth Requirements". It urges the Board of Trustees to make the Cal-GETC related changes to Title 5 by September to allow as much time as possible for its implementation.

#### **Providing Timely and Quality Counseling Within the CSU**

Calls for the CSU to sever its relationship with the third-party mental health provider TimelyMD and instead invest that money into expanding counseling services and tenure-track counselors across the CSU.

# **Maintaining Educational Continuity During Emergencies and Disasters**Calls for the CSU and each campus to develop an Educational Continuity policy that would be immediately activated in emergencies (whether locally or statewide). Includes best practices to consider when developing such policies.

#### **Auditing the Mercer Faculty Salary Study Findings**

Requests an independent review of the Mercer faculty salary study findings. Also requests that all data and models, particularly the regression models, be released to the ASCSU for review. It requests that comparable institutions be better aligned with the geographical realities in California (e.g., cost of living, housing availability, and other sociopolitical factors) as well as comparing CSU salaries with those in the CCC and UC systems.

### **Endorsing the Recommendations of the General Education Advisory Committee (GEAC) on Upper Division GE and American Institutions**

Reports that GEAC has acted on the charge given to it by the Chancellor's Office to consider whether changes are needed to the System's upper division GE and American Institutions policies. Endorses the conclusion reached after careful consideration that there are no compelling reasons to change current policies at the present time.

#### 14. AS-3623-23/FGA/AA

### In Support of Joining the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA)

ASCSU supports California joining NC-SARA which will considerably reduce costs to CSU campuses when offering programs to out of state students.

### ASCSU Position on California Community College Spring 2023 Bachelor's Degree Program Proposals

As noted in AS-3613-23/AA (Rev), the Academic Affairs Committee worked with the Chancellor's Office to identify California Community College bachelor's degree program proposals that duplicate existing CSU programs. This resolution catalogs those found to be duplicative and those it did not consider duplicative.
