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## RE: CSU Student Housing Data Collection report – Annual Report

The enclosed report is submitted in compliance with the requirements set forth in California Education Code 66014.6 – Student housing for postsecondary education; data collection. The Code stipulates that each California State University (CSU) campus that provides campus-owned, campus-operated, or campus-affiliated student housing is required to post on its external and internal internet websites, at least twice each academic year, all of the following information:

- (1) The number of enrolled students.
- (2) Existing campus housing stock, including, but not limited to, the number of available beds on campus.
- (3) The number of students on the campus housing waiting list, and how many students have removed themselves from the waiting list since the last report.
- (4) If available, the number of students who request campus-owned, campus-operated, or campus-affiliated student housing.



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(5) If available, the number of incoming freshmen, transfer students, and international students requiring campus-owned, campus-operated, or campus-affiliated student housing.

The table below shows CSU enrollment and housing data as of July 1, 2023 to fulfill the annual reporting requirement due on or before October 15. The data is also posted on CSU campuses' websites and accessible by the general public, including CSU students and parents.

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## Please note:

- 1. The report does not account for students who choose to live outside of university housing facilities.
- 2. The number of students who request housing (column E) represents the number of housing applicants.
- 3. The number of incoming freshmen, transfer students, and international students requiring student housing (column F) includes students who are required to live on campus pursuant to live-on requirements.
- 4. Waitlists vary from campus to campus based on inventory and demand. Several campuses have reported that they do not currently have a waitlist and are able to accommodate all eligible students who choose to apply.
