- Address student hunger
- Leverage more sustainable solutions to address basic needs on campus
- Raise awareness of services currently offered on campus that address basic needs
- Develop formal practices and procedures
- Continue to build strategic partnerships with community/statewide partners and CSU campuses

Review Process

- 8 readers
 - CSU CO staff
 - CSU campus representation
 - Non-profit org
- Each proposal was read by <u>AT LEAST</u> 3 different reviewers
- Reviews were captured through an online spreadsheet,
 and discussed in a 2-hour Zoom meeting





Overview

- Proposals were varied in length & scope
- Campus Info
 - 100% applied for SB 85 funding
 - 52% applied for the max funding amounts
 - 65% applied for Innovation Award funding
 - 100% are receiving funding
 - 12 Innovation Awards
- \$2.1M+ going directly to campuses
 - Remaining funds will go towards supporting campus efforts through professional development, technical assistance, and marketing
 - Funding cycle: March 2018 June 30, 2019

Reporting Template(s)

- Template will include a budget check & measurable impact variables
 - # of pantry visits
 - # of CalFresh visits/application assistance/approval rate
 - # of meals shared with students
 - Targeted outreach to traditionally underrepresented student ethnic groups
- Reporting due dates
 - August 31st, 2018: 1 2 pages (Calendar, planned activities, outcomes)
 - January 31st, 2019: 1 2 pages (Interim Progress report)
 - June 28th, 2019: Comprehensive
