**Fall 2020 CSU Enrollment**



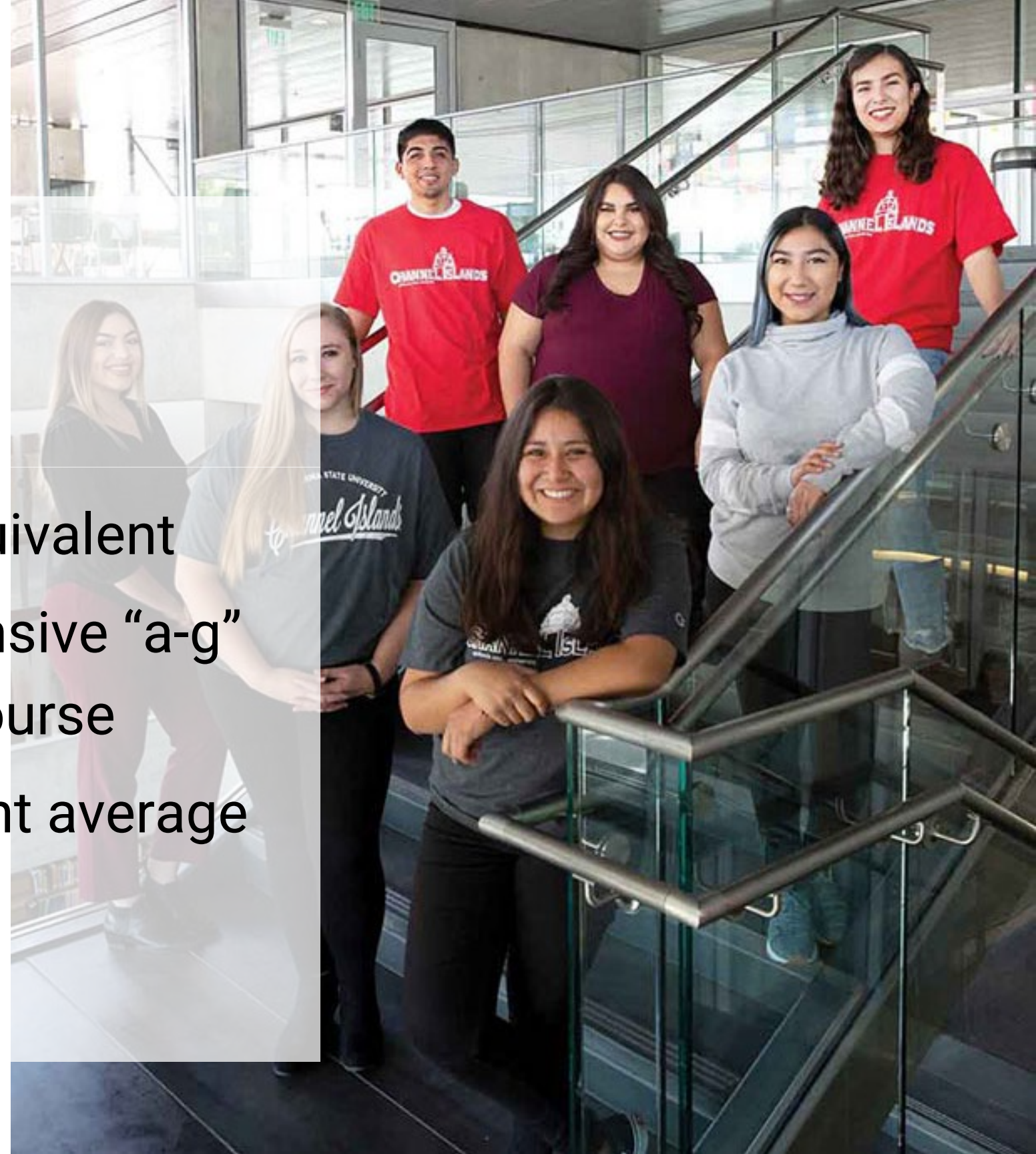

# Fall 2022 Freshman Eligibility

- Be a high school graduate or equivalent
- Complete the 15-unit comprehensive “a-g” pattern of college preparatory course
- Earn a qualifying “a-g” grade point average (GPA)





# Fall 2022 Qualifying “a-g” GPAs

- CSU Minimum Eligibility
  - California residents and graduates of California high schools with a **2.50 or greater** “a-g” GPA
  - Non-California residents earning a 3.00 or greater “a-g” GPA
- *Campus Decision* to Evaluate for Admission Using Supplemental Factors
  - California high school graduates or residents of California earning a **GPA between 2.00 and 2.49**
  - Non-California high school graduate or non-residents of California earning a GPA between 2.47 and 2.99
- Not CSU Eligible
  - California high school graduates or residents of California earning a **GPA 1.99 or below**
  - Non-California high school graduates or non-residents of California earning a GPA 2.46 or below

# Supplemental Factors

- Each CSU campus will determine the supplemental factors used
- Impacted campuses and programs may also use supplemental factors
- Supplemental factors include:
  - Math/QR GPA
  - English GPA
  - Lab Science GPA
  - Courses exceeding minimum “a-g” courses
  - Math/QR Courses exceeding 3 years
  - Promise/Partnership Programs
  - 66% or more free & reduced lunch school
  - First generation
  - Household income
  - Educational program participation
  - Youth services
  - Work experience
  - Extracurricular involvement
  - Leadership roles



# Campus Use of Supplemental Factors

- Fully Impacted Campuses
  - All Programs and populations
- Impacted at First-time Freshman Level & Some Programs
  - All impacted programs and populations
- Program Impaction Only or No Impaction
  - Programs that are impacted
  - Campus Decision Populations
- Impacted programs may keep their process as long as no SAT/ACT test scores are part of evaluation



# A-G Course Grades

- Grades of “credit” or “pass” as fulfilling “a-g” requirements for those courses completed during **Winter, Spring, Summer or Fall 2020 terms and during Winter, Spring or Summer 2021** terms
  - The CSU expects and assumes that high school Pass (Credit) grades will represent work completed at the C- or higher level.
- Credit or Pass grades used for validation
- Fall 2021 forward expect graded courses
- CSU accommodations go above AB104



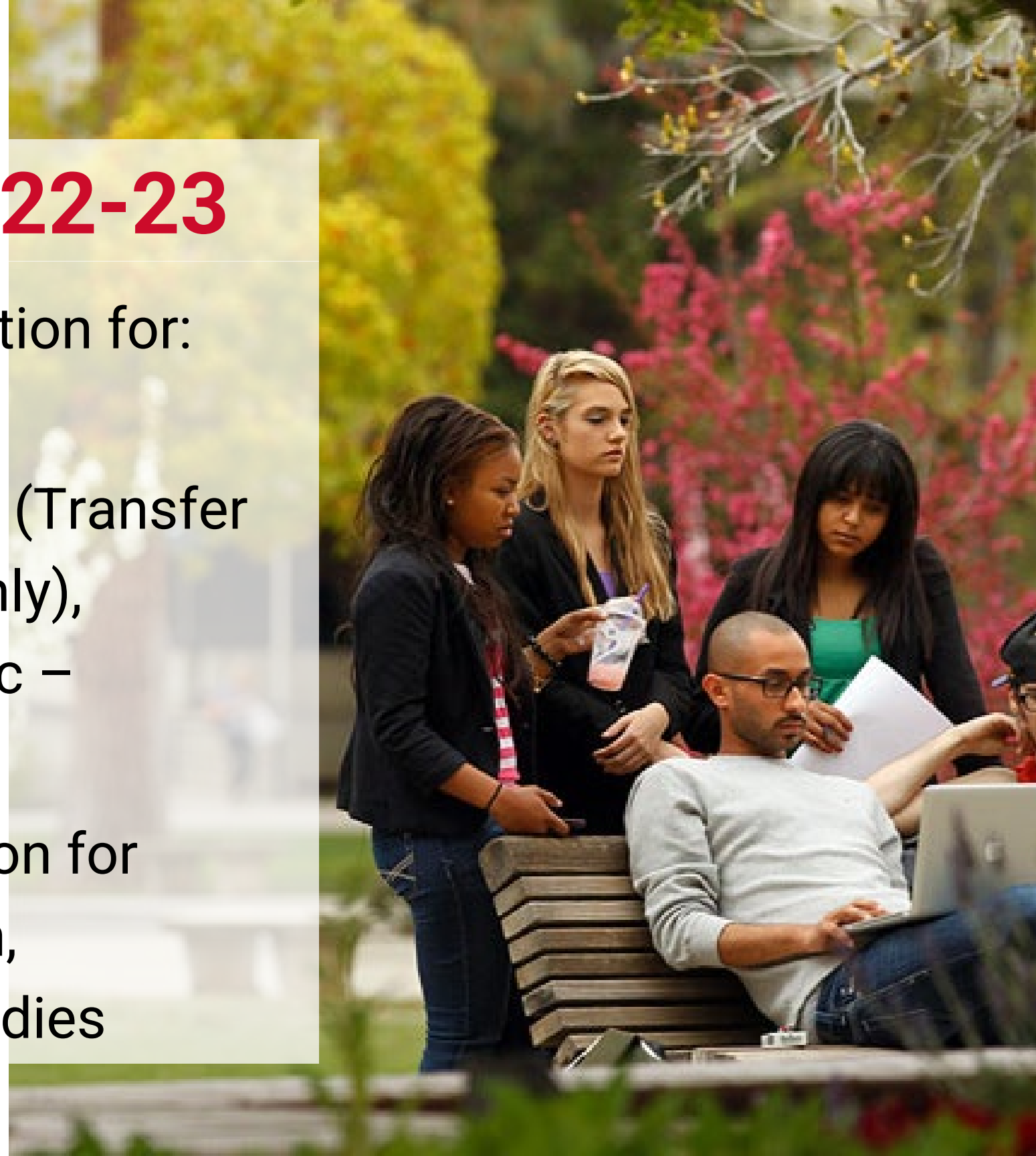
# Academic Preparation and Placement

- ALL students are strongly encouraged to enroll in their senior-year English course and a year-long mathematics/quantitative reasoning course
- SAT/ACT will be used for placement purposes **ONLY**

# Impaction Changes 2022-23

- **Humboldt** – Discontinued impaction for: Wildlife
- **Pomona** – Impacted Psychology (Transfer Only) and Sociology (Transfer Only), discontinued impaction for Music – Industry Option
- **Sonoma** – Discontinued impaction for Biology, Business Administration, Communications and Liberal Studies

- Student can import coursework from CaliforniaColleges.edu to Cal State Apply
- Managed on behalf of the state by California College Guidance Initiative (CCGI)
- AB132 passed in July authorizes the development of the Cradle to Career Data System
- Part of the data system involves scaling CCGI's work to all 6<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade students in the state.
- This will make CCGI's services free to districts serving 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade students beginning in 2022-23.

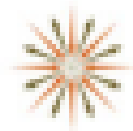
## Completion of Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning General Education the First Year

## Requirement

- Science course
  - Elective course with quantitative reasoning foundation
  - Traditional mathematics course (beyond Alg. II or Integrated Math III)
  - Select Career and Technical Education courses
  - Dual Enrollment courses
  - Qualifying elective course examples:
    - Coding
    - Computer Science
    - Economics
    - Engineering
    - Personal Finance
    - Robotics
    - Sports Medicine
    - Veterinary Science





# Guidelines for Pursuing QR Proposal

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Third-party independent analysis

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Doubling of STEM qualified teachers

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Clarification of the role and charge of the steering committee

Clarity on exemptions for students

---

Progress on outreach and awareness

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1. CSU Access

Potential effects the proposed policy change may have on all California public high school students' **access** to the CSU system.

2. Success at CSU

Associations between additional quantitative reasoning course taking in high school and students' college **success** at a CSU.

3. Disparate Effects

Potential disparate effects the policy change may have on underserved students including students of color and low-income students.

4. Implementation

An assessment of the implementation needs for the proposed change to be successful and equitable.

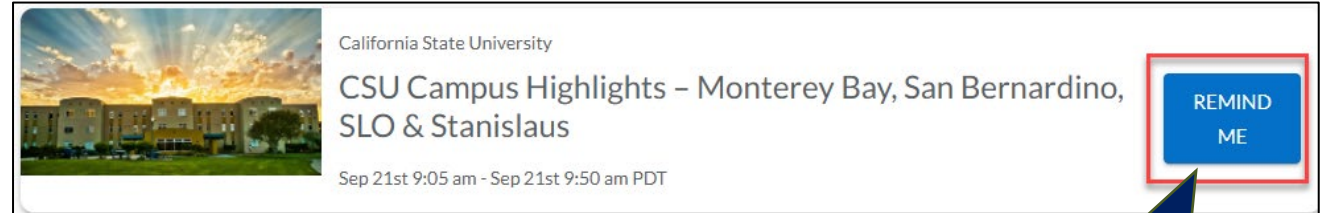

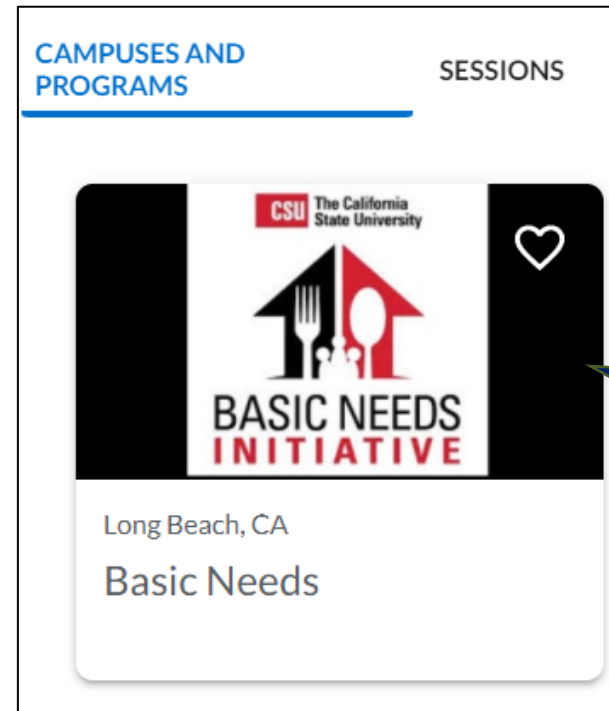
