

# Fall 2022 Freshman Eligibility

- Be a high school graduate or equivalent
- Complete the 15-unit comprehensive "a-g" pattern of college preparatory course
- Earn a qualifying "a-g" grade point average (GPA)





# Fall 2022 Qualifying "a-g" GPAs

### CSU Minimum Eligibility

- California residents and graduates of California high schools with a <u>2.50 or greater</u> "a-g" GPA
- Non-California residents earning a 3.00 or greater "a-g" GPA

### Campus Decision to Evaluate for Admission Using Supplemental Factors

- California high school graduates or residents of California earning a <u>GPA between 2.00 and</u> <u>2.49</u>
- Non-California high school graduate or non-residents of California earning a GPA between 2.47and 2.99

### Not CSU Eligible

- California high school graduates or residents of California earning a GPA 1.99 or below
- Non-California high school graduates or non-residents of California earning a GPA 2.46 or below





# **Supplemental Factors**

**Supplemental Factors Summary - Counselor Resources** 

- Each CSU campus will determine the supplemental factors used
- Impacted campuses and programs may also use supplemental factors
- Supplemental factors include:
  - Math/QR GPA
  - **English GPA**
  - Lab Science GPA
  - Courses exceeding minimum "a-g" courses
  - Math/QR Courses exceeding 3 years
  - **Promise/Partnership Programs**
  - 66% or more free & reduced lunch school
  - First generation
  - Household income
  - Educational program participation

  - Leadership roles



### **Campus Use of Supplemental Factors**

- **Fully Impacted Campuses** 
  - All Programs and populations •
- Impacted at First-time Freshman Level & Some Programs
  - All impacted programs and populations
- **Program Impaction Only or No Impaction** 
  - Programs that are impacted
  - **Campus Decision Populations**
- Impacted programs may keep their process as long as no SAT/ACT test scores are part of evaluation

# **A-G Course Grades**

- Grades of "credit" or "pass" as fulfilling "a-g" requirements for those courses completed during *Winter, Spring, Summer or* Fall 2020 terms and during Winter, Spring or Summer 2021 terms
  - The CSU expects and assumes that high school Pass (Credit) grades will represent work completed at the C- or higher level.
- Credit or Pass grades used for validation
- Fall 2021 forward expect graded courses
- CSU accommodations go above AB104




