#### Who is a Transfer Student?

- A student who has:
  - Left or graduated high school, AND
  - Enrolls in a regular session (fall/winter/spring) at a regionally accredited college <u>after leaving high school</u>


### Who is **NOT** a Transfer Student?

- A student who has:
- Taken college courses in the summer immediately following HS completion
- Earned an AA degree or junior standing through dual enrollment while attending HS
- Completed college courses while in HS
- Taken a gap year after HS without attending another college

#### **CCC Transfer Enrollment**




## Why Transfer?

- Explore academic or career goals
- Are not able to leave home
- Interested in saving money and incurring less debt
- Not interested in attending the 4-year schools admitted
- More flexibility in course offerings

### **Elements of CSU Degree**

- General Education
  - 48 semester units
    - 39 can be taken at a CCC
- Major Preparation Coursework
  - Varies typically 30 70 semester units
  - May overlap with GE (double count)
- Electives
  - Whatever is needed to hit 120\* semester units



## **Upper Division Transfer (UDT)**


- To be admitted as an UDT student they must:
  - have completed a minimum of 60 semester units or transferable coursework;
  - have an overall college GPA of at least 2.0 GPA
  - be in good standing at the last college or university attended
  - have completed the "Golden Four" with a grade of C- or better

## **Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)**

#### https://icangotocollege.com/

- Established by SB1440 in 2010
- Established pathways for transfer from CCC to CSU
  - Some independent non-profit and HBCU colleges now accept ADTs
- Clear course taking pathways (AA-T or AS-T)
- Students who pursue a similar degree (Sociology ADT -> Sociology BA)
  - Admission Priority
  - Admitted with junior Status
  - Graduate in 60 units

## **Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)**

- To be admitted as an ADT student they must:
  - have earned or be completing an approved Associate Degree for Transfer (AA-T or AS-T) at the time you apply
  - have completed a minimum of 18 semester or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis and an approved set of generaleducation requirements
  - have an overall college GPA of at least 2.0 GPA
  - be in good standing at the last college or university attended

## Lower Division Transfer (LDT)

- To be admitted as an LDT student they must:
  - have completed "a-g" course requirements in high school
  - have graduated from high school or equivalency
  - Meet first-time freshman admission requirements
  - have an overall college GPA of at least 2.0 GPA
  - be in good standing at the last college or university attended
  - have completed, with a grade of C- or better, A2 written communication and B4 - mathematics or quantitative reasoning
- Note: few campuses accept LDTs due to enrollment pressures

#### **Mid-Year Transfers**

- Many CSU campuses accept transfer students in the spring term.
- Most majors are available
  - Some are closed due to programs only starting in fall term, i.e. nursing
- Students still need to meet all admission requirements

### Impaction and Selection

- Many programs are impacted at the transfer level
- Students need to ensure they research the campus(es) and major(s) they are interested
- Ensure they complete major preparation coursework
- ASSIST provides information on coursework information.

#### Tips for Advising Students on the Transfer Path

- 1. Apply and register at the CCC as soon as possible
- 2. Connect with the Transfer Center or Counseling as soon as possible
- 3. Request an educational plan
- 4. Consider taking a college success or career exploration class
- 5. Proactively reach out to counselors and ask questions
- 6. Report any AP or IB exam scores as soon as possible
- 7. Consider going to the CCC full time 30 units per academic year
- 8. Do their own research on courses Use ASSIST.org and CSU campus websites
- 9. Use faculty office hours

## **CCC Student Support Programs**

- Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS)
  - Students disadvantaged by social, economic, educational or linguistic barriers
- NextUp (EOPS Program)
  - Current or former foster youth
- Umoja Community
  - Dedicated to enhancing cultural and education experiences of African American and other students.



#### Financial Aid Considerations

- Pell Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU): 6 years
- Pell received while at a CC will reduce remaining Pell eligibility at a 4-year school
- Cal Grant eligibility limited to 4 years
- Subsidized Loan Lifetime Eligibility
  - 6-year limit on Subsidized Loans
  - Borrowing at a CC may affect eligibility for Subsidized loan at a 4-year
- Units attempted at CC may affect overall financial aid eligibility at a 4-year school
  - Satisfactory academic progress (maximum time frame)
  - Regardless if aid was received or not
- Units earned at CCC affect CSU State University Grant eligibility at a CSU
  - Regardless if aid was received or not

#### **Transfer Resources**

#### **CCC Transfer Centers**

- Allow CSU reps to visit
- Host CSU workshops
- Organize transfer college fairs
- Support CSU application process
- Provide advising

#### **ASSIST**

- Online tool that reflects CSU Transferable Course List
- Identifies
   acceptable courses
   to meet CSU
   transfer
   requirements at all
   CCCs

#### **CSU Campuses**

- Provide support for students who want to transfer
- Provide support for major preparation coursework
