Re: 2022-23 PRELIMINARY LOTTERY ALLOCATIONS, CAMPUS-BASED PROGRAMS

In the last five years, Lottery receipts have consistently exceeded conservative estimates, and costs of systemwide initiatives (e.g., the Early Start Program tuition waivers and the Dream Loan Program) are well established and within budget. The Board of Trustees approved a \$63 million Lottery budget for 2022-23, which included a \$4.1 million increase to campus-based programs.

The increase brings the total for campus-based programs to \$39.7 million, or \$104 per resident target full-time equivalent student (FTES), which is allocated directly to campuses, allowing presidents flexibility to meet unique campus needs. Funding is distributed based on each campus' 2022-23 preliminary resident FTES target. Final campus-based Lottery allocations will be communicated to campuses when 2022-23 resident FTES targets are finalized.

The table below shows the Lottery budget changes from 2021-22 to 2022-23 by campus. Lottery funds on each campus must be spent according to systemwide guidelines.
